### **MINUTES OF JACKSON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING**

**JUNE 14, 2022**

Hawke called the meeting to order at 3:32 p.m. at the Jackson Township Hall with Trustees Todd Hawke, John Pizzino and Jim Thomas present. Fiscal Officer Gonzalez, Assistant Law Director FitzSimmons, Police Chief Brink, Fire Chief Berczik, Zoning Inspector Poindexter, and Public Works Director Rohn were also in attendance.

The first order of business was a work session to discuss Ohio's new fireworks law and the amphitheater restroom/concession project.

Whereas, at the request of the Developer, it is necessary and in the best interests of the Township for this Board of Township Trustees to approve an amendment (the “Amendment”) to the Tax Increment Financing Agreement.

Be it resolved that, by the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township:

1. Amendment to Tax Increment Financing Agreement. This Board of Trustees finds and determines that the Tax Increment Financing Agreement shall be amended in order to provide for an increase to the Developer’s share of the Service Payments to be deposited in the Township’s Public Improvement Tax Increment Equivalent Fund in connection with the intention of the Developer to create a future redevelopment project as further described in the form of the Amendment attached hereto as Exhibit A;

2. The Board of Trustees hereby approve the form of the Amendment attached hereto as Exhibit A. The Fiscal Officer, Trustees and other appropriate Township officials are further authorized to provide such information and to execute, certify or furnish such other documents, and to do all other things as are necessary for and incidental to carrying out the provisions of the Amendment.

3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of Jackson Township concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Township Trustees, and that all deliberations of the Township Trustees and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Hawke moved and Thomas seconded a motion that a hearing having been had upon the attached petition requesting that the Board of Jackson Township Trustees take all lawful and proper proceedings to light artificially the streets and public ways in an unincorporated district in this Township, following notice and actual view taken, and the Board of Township Trustees finding:

(1) That the petition was filed with the Township Fiscal Officer on May 11, 2022 and that the Board of Township Trustees was duly notified by him of such filing and a copy of the petition was delivered to it on May 16, 2022.

(2) That the petition was signed by owners of more than one-half of the front feet of the lots and lands abutting on the streets and public ways of the aforesaid district, and that the petition complied with the law in specifying the metes and bounds of the district but included no lands more than 660 feet from, nor any lands not abutting on, the streets and public ways in such districts; and

(3) That due notice of a hearing before the Board of Township Trustees on the petition for The Woods at Emerald Estates 13 was duly and timely served on all lot owners and corporation affected by the proposed improvement, and was duly and timely published as against nonresidents pursuant to ORC 515.04, and return of due service and publication was made according to law.

Be it further resolved by the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, that the proposed improvement to light artificially the streets and public ways in the district is necessary, and the petition is granted accordingly; that the number of lights necessary to light properly the streets and public ways is 2, that the lights shall be standard street light lumens; that they shall be located at the places described in the attached print; and that the kind of supports therefore shall be as described on the attached Information Agreement Form.

Be it further resolved that, pursuant to ORC Sections 9.30 and 515.08 and in accordance with the ESIP Agreement with Ohio Edison, we hereby contract with Ohio Edison for not less than one (1) year and shall continue thereafter until terminated sixty (60) days after either party has given written notice to the other of the intention to terminate, for the operating costs of the lights

described in the attached plan in the amount of approximately \$8.43 per light per month for a total of \$202.32 per year. The Developer is responsible for payment of the installation cost and/or connection fee for this street lighting.

Be it further resolved that the costs and expenses of furnishing and maintaining such lights shall be paid from a fund made by special assessment against the lots and lands in the district semiannually equally per lot and the Fiscal Officer shall certify the assessment to the Stark County Auditor's Office.

### **RESOLUTION 22-163 ATTACHED**

#### **OHIO'S NEW FIREWORKS LAW**

Hawke moved and Thomas seconded a motion whereas, the Ohio General Assembly passed H.B. 172 (Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3743), which created a new statutory scheme for the possession, use and restrictions for the discharge of consumer grade fireworks in Ohio; and,

Whereas, effective July 1, 2022, and pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3743.45, a township may restrict the dates and times a person may discharge, ignite, or explode fireworks.

Be it resolved that, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3743.45(B) and (D), effective July 1, 2022, a person may discharge, ignite, or explode consumer grade (1.4G) fireworks on private property, with authorization from the property owner, on the following days each year:

- (1) The first day of January (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.);
- (2) Chinese New Year's Day (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.);
- (3) The fifth day of May (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.);
- (4) The last Monday in May, and the Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding that day (Memorial Day Weekend 4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., each day);
- (5) The nineteenth day of June (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.);
- (6) The third (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.), fourth (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.), and fifth (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.) days of July;
- (7) The first Friday, Saturday, and Sunday before and after the fourth day of July (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., each day);
- (8) The first Monday of September, and the Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding that day (Labor Day Weekend 4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., each day);
- (9) Diwali (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.);
- (10) The thirty-first day of December (4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.).

Further be it resolved that, Ohio Revised Code Section 3743.45 does not limit the enforcement of any resolution, or statute that regulates noise, disturbance of the peace, or disorderly conduct.
