Sealed bids for the Jackson Township Amphitheater LED Video Screen will be received at the Office of the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, 5735 Wales Avenue NW, Massillon, Ohio 44646 until 3:00 P.M. local time on Tuesday, October 24, 2023. Bids will be publicly opened and read on Tuesday, October 24, 2023 at 5:00 p.m., unless extended by written notice of the change shall be given to all persons who have received or requested the specification no later than 72 hours prior to the date fixed for such opening.

**To access this Project through the Township's website ([www.jacksononwp.com](http://www.jacksononwp.com)) we ask that you first email Shelby Curlutu, Receptionist, ([scurlutu@jacksononwp.com](mailto:scurlutu@jacksononwp.com)) and provide your Company's name, address, phone number, and email address so that any addenda issued is sent to you in a timely fashion.** If you do not submit this information, the Township is not responsible for any errors caused in your Company's submitted bid. There is no charge for accessing the bid documents through the Township's website. No paper copies will be sold.

The above project requires the bidder to furnish of all labor, equipment, material, appurtenances, and incidentals required for Jackson Township Amphitheater LED Video Screen. The construction plans for the Jackson Amphitheater itself and the impacted wall are available at [www.jacksononwp.com](http://www.jacksononwp.com) for inspection and examination of all persons interested and at the Jackson Township Public Works Department located at 5735 Wales Avenue NW, Massillon, Ohio 44646 during regular business hours beginning September 18, 2023. No paper copies will be sold.

Each bid and all certificates shall be upon the forms furnished with the specifications and shall be delivered to the Jackson Township Administrative Offices at or prior to the date and hour specified for receiving bids. Each bid shall be in conformity with the Revised Code of Ohio, shall contain the names of every person and company interested therein, and shall be on the forms included in the specifications. Each bidder must submit evidence of its' experiences on projects of similar size and complexity. Each bid shall be accompanied by a proper certificate by corporations not chartered in Ohio testifying that such corporation is authorized to do business in Ohio.

All contractors and subcontractors involved with the project will, to the extent practicable use Ohio products, materials, services, and labor in the implementation of their project. Preference will be given to contractors having their principal place of business in Ohio over contractors having their principal place of business in a state which provides a preference in that state in favor of contractors of that state for the same type of work.

Construction work shall be subject to the prevailing wage rates established by the Ohio Department of Industrial Relations. Each bidder must insure that all employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of race, creed, sex, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, or color.

No contract shall be entered into unless the bidder possesses a valid certificate of compliance with affirmative action programs issued pursuant to section [9.47](#) of the Revised Code and dated no earlier than one hundred eighty days prior to the date fixed for the opening of bids for a particular project.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a bid guaranty in the form of: 1) a certified check, or cashier's check, or letter of credit, equal to ten percent (10%) of the bid; or 2) a bid guaranty bond for the full amount of the bid; both forms of a guaranty as provided in Ohio Revised Code 153.54 and in the

project specifications. The amount of the bid for said guaranty purposes should include all additive and deductive alternates. All bid guaranties shall be conditioned that if the bid is accepted within sixty (60) days of the opening, a proper contract shall be executed, and that upon failure or refusal to enter into said contract within ten (10) days after receipt of notification of award the bidder and the surety on any bond shall be liable to the township in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the bid. At the option of the Jackson Township Trustees, such bond/check will be returned to all except the apparent low bidder; however, the bond/checks of all unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately upon award of the contract or the rejection of all bids.

The estimate for this Project is contained in the Project Specifications. Ohio Revised Code Section 153.12 prohibits the Jackson Township Trustees from awarding a bid if the price is more than ten percent (10%) in excess of said estimated cost.

A contract will be awarded to the lowest and best bidder who meets requirements of ORC Section 153.54. The Jackson Township Trustees reserve the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any informalities or irregularities in the bids received and to accept any bid or combination of bids which is deemed most favorable to the Township at the time and under the conditions stipulated. Terms of payment are as provided in Chapter 153 of the Ohio Revised Code. Work shall not begin prior to the authorization in writing by the Board of Township Trustees. Time of completion is located in Section 102.23.

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## SECTION 102

### INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS

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## **SECTION 102 - INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS**

**102.01 - CONTRACT DOCUMENTS** - The "Advertisement for Bids", "Information for Bidders", "Proposal", "Bid Bond", "Agreement", "General Conditions", "Payment Bond", "Performance Bond", "Notice of Award", "Notice to Proceed", "Change Order", "Technical Specifications", and "Addenda", are the documents that shall form the contract. Bidders must examine each of the Contract Documents.

**102.02 - ADDENDA AND INTERPRETATION** - **No interpretation of the meaning of the plans, specifications or other contract documents will be made to any bidder, orally. Request for such interpretations should be delivered via email, addressed to Public Works Director Richard R. Rohn at [rrohn@jacksonwp.com](mailto:rrohn@jacksonwp.com).** To be given consideration, requests must be received at least five (5) days prior to the time fixed for the opening of bids. Any and all such interpretations and any supplemental instructions will be in the form of written addenda to the specifications which will be received by the prospective bidders, at the addresses furnished for such purposes no later than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the time fixed for the opening of such bids.

**102.03 - POSTPONEMENT OF BID OPENINGS** - The Owner reserves the right to postpone the date of presentation and opening of proposals and will give written or telegraphic notice of any such postponements to each prospective bidder at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time fixed for the opening of bids.

**102.04 - EXAMINATION OF CONTRACT AND PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS** - The bidders must examine the technical specifications, drawings, and all other requirements of the proposed items, and exercise their own judgment as to the extent of the work to be done. The contractor must assume all risk of variance in any interpretation of the specifications by whomsoever made, and agree to fully furnish each item in accordance with the specifications for the price bid.

**102.05 - PROPOSAL FORMS** - All proposals must be made on the required Proposal Form attached hereto. All blank spaces for prices must be filled in, in ink, or typewritten, and the Proposal Form must be fully completed and executed when submitted. When provision is made in the Proposal Form for amounts to be both written and printed, they must be properly filled in, and in the event of any discrepancy between written and printed amounts, the written amount will be used. The Board of Trustees of Jackson Township will review any explanation, modification or stipulation accompanying a proposal to determine if the bid proposal is responsive to the specifications. Each proposal must be submitted in a sealed envelope, addressed to the Owner at the address given in the Invitation for Bids. Each sealed envelope containing a Proposal must be plainly marked on the outside as JACKSON TOWNSHIP AMPHITHEATER LED VIDEO SCREEN and the envelope should bear the name of the bidder, their address and phone number, and addressed to the Owner at the address given in the Invitation for Bids. Proposals must be received on or before the date and time indicated in the "Invitation to Bid".

When an item in the proposal contains a choice to be designated by the bidder, the bidder shall indicate their choice in accordance with the specifications for that particular item, and thereafter no further choice will be permitted. The proposal shall include a properly executed non-collusion affidavit. The bidder's proposal must be signed in ink by the individual, by one or more members of the partnership, by one or more members or officers of each firm representing a joint venture, or by one or more officers of a corporation, or by an agent of the Contractor legally qualified and acceptable to the Owner. If the proposal is made by an Individual, his name and business address must be shown; by a partnership, the name and business address of each partnership member must be shown; as a joint venture, the name and business address of each member or officer of the firms represented by the joint venture must be shown; by a corporation, the name of the state under the laws of which the corporation is chartered and the name and title of the officer or officers having authority under the by-laws to sign contracts, the name of the corporation and the business address

of its corporate officers must be shown. Anyone signing a proposal as agent must file with it legal evidence of this authority to do so.

Before a contract will be awarded to a foreign corporation or a person or partnership who is not a resident of the State of Ohio, a certificate from the Secretary of State will be required stipulating that such corporation is authorized to do business in the State of Ohio or that such person or partnership has filed with the Secretary of State a power of attorney designating the Secretary of State his or its agent for the purpose of accepting summons for any action relating to the contract or brought under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Law or any other law of the State of Ohio.

**102.06 - BID GUARANTY BOND** - Each bid shall be accompanied by a bid guaranty in one of the following two forms:

1. **BID GUARANTY - FORM 1** - A bid guaranty bond for the full amount of the bid, including all additive and deductive alternates, conditioned to:
  - A. Provide that, if the bid is accepted, the bidder will, after the awarding of the contract, enter into a proper contract in accordance with the bid, plans, details, and specifications. If for any reason, other than as authorized by Sections 9.31 or 153.54(G) Ohio Revised Code, the bidder fails to enter into the contract, and the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township award the contract to the next lowest bidder, the bidder and the surety on his bond are liable to the Township for the difference between his bid and that of the next lowest bidder, or for a penal sum not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount of the bond, whichever is less. If the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township do not award the contract to the next lowest bidder, but resubmit the project for bidding, the bidder failing to enter into the contract and the surety on his bond, except as provided in Section 153.54(G) Ohio Revised Code, are liable to the Township for a penal sum not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount of the bid or the costs in connection with the resubmission, of printing new contract documents, required advertising, and printing and mailing notices to prospective bidders, whichever is less.
  - B. Indemnify the Township against all damage suffered by failure to perform the contract according to its provisions and in accordance with the plans, details, and specifications therefor and to pay all lawful claims of subcontractors, materialmen and laborers for labor performed or material furnished in carrying forward, performing or completing the contract; and agree and assent that this undertaking is for the benefit of any subcontractor, materialman, or laborer having a just claim as well as for the Township.

The bond form shall be the attached Township's Bid Guaranty and Performance Bond, and recovery of any claimant thereunder shall be subject to Ohio Revised Code Sections 153.01 to 153.60, to the same extent as if the provisions of such Sections were fully incorporated in said bond form.

2. **BID GUARANTY - FORM 2** - A bid guaranty of certified check, cashier's check or letter of credit pursuant to Chapter 1305 of the Ohio Revised Code, equal to ten percent (10%) of the bid, including all additive and deductive alternates. Any such letter of credit shall be revocable only at the option of the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township.

All such guarantees shall be made payable to the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township.

The bid guaranty shall be conditioned to provide that if the bid is accepted, the bidder will, after the awarding of the contract, enter into a proper contract in accordance with the bid, plans, and specifications. If, for any reason other than as authorized by Sections 9.31 or

153.54(G) Ohio Revised Code, the bidder fails to enter into the contract and the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township award the contract to the next lowest bidder, the bidder shall be liable to the Township for the difference between his bid and that of the next lowest bidder, or for a penal sum not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount of the bid, whichever is less. If the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township does not award the contract to the next lowest bidder, but resubmits the project for bidding, the bidder failing to enter into the contract, except as provided in Section 153.54(G) Ohio Revised Code, is liable to the Township for a penal sum not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount of the bid or the costs in connection with the resubmission, of printing new contract documents, required advertising, and printing and mailing notices to prospective bidders, whichever is less.

If the bidder enters into the contract, the bidder shall, at the time he enters into the contract, file a performance bond for the amount of the contract to indemnify the Township against all damage suffered by failure to perform the contract according to its provisions and in accordance with the plans, details, and specifications therefor and to pay all lawful claims of subcontractors, materialmen, and laborers for labor performed or material furnished in carrying forward, performing or completing the contract; and agree and assent that his undertaking is for the benefit of any subcontractor, materialman, or laborer having a just claim, as well as for the Township.

The bond form shall be the attached Township's Performance Bond (Section 104.03). Recovery of any claimant under the performance bond shall be subject to Ohio Revised Code Sections 153.01 to 153.60, to the same extent as if the provisions of such Sections were fully incorporated in said bond form.

The bid guaranty in the form of a certified check, cashier's check, or letter of credit filed with bids will be returned to the successful bidder upon filing of the performance bond described above.

**102.07 - OTHER REQUIREMENTS FOR BID GUARANTIES AND PERFORMANCE BONDS** - All bid guaranties shall be payable to the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, shall be for the benefit of the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio or any person having a right of actions thereon, and shall be deposited with, and held by, the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township. All bid guaranty and performance bonds shall be issued by a surety company authorized to do business in Ohio.

No time limit for the instituting of suit shall be added to the Bond Form.

Identification of the project shall be listed on the Bond.

As Principal, the Bond shall be signed by the same or two officials authorized to sign the construction contract. (See instructions for signing Jackson Township Contracts).

All signatures shall be original signatures. Facsimile signatures are NOT acceptable.

**102.08 - POWER OF ATTORNEY** - The Surety's Power of Attorney and authorization to do business in Ohio shall be attached to the Bond. Powers of Attorney in one of the following forms will be acceptable:

1. Power of Attorney executed with original signatures.
2. A copy of the original Power of Attorney duly certified by property corporate officers.
3. A duplicate Power of Attorney which is a reproduction of the entire original Power of Attorney

produced photographically, chemically, or by other equivalent techniques that accurately reproduces the original.

**NOTE:** Blank unexecuted Powers of Attorney to which facsimile "rubber stamped" signatures have been affixed is not acceptable!

The above Power of Attorney requirements apply to Bid Guaranty Bonds, Performance Bonds or any other bond required by the Specifications.

**102.09 - RETURN OF BID GUARANTIES** - Bid guaranties will be returned to unsuccessful bidders immediately after the contract is executed.

The bid guaranty in the form of a certified check, cashier's check, or letter of credit will be returned to the successful bidder upon the filing of a satisfactory performance bond.

In the event of rejection of bids, all bid guaranties will be returned to the bidders.

**102.10 - EXECUTION OF CONTRACT WITHIN 10 DAYS** - Where the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township accepts a bid but the bidder fails at or refuses to enter into a proper contract in accordance with the bid, plans, and specifications within ten (10) days after receipt of notification of award, the bidder and the surety on any bond shall, except as provided in Section 153.54(G) of the Ohio Revised Code, be liable for the amount of difference between his bid and that of the next lowest bidder, but not in excess of the liability specified in Section 153.54(B)(1), (C) or (G), of the Ohio Revised Code. Liability on account of an award to the third lowest bidder, or when applicable, the fourth lowest bidder or beyond, shall be determined in a like manner.

Enter into "a proper contract" means that within ten (10) days after receipt of the Township's notification of award, the successful bidder shall file with the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, the following documents exactly in the manner specified.

1. Signed contract with Certified Corporation Resolution, or notarized statement of partnership or as sole owner.
2. A performance bond for the full amount of the contract if the bid guaranty was in the form of a certified check, cashier's check or letter of credit.
3. Certificate of Insurance.
4. Current Ohio Workers Compensation Certificate.
5. A statement in accordance with ORC Section 5719.042 stating whether the bidder had delinquent personal property taxes at the time of the bid.

Upon failure to file the documents listed above in the manner specified by the Township with ten (10) days of notification of the award, the bidder and/or the surety on any bond shall be liable to the Township under their bid guaranty.

**102.11 - DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS** - Any of the following reasons may be considered sufficient for the disqualification of a bidder and the rejection of their proposal or proposals.

1. Evidence of collusion among bidders. Participants in such collusion will receive no recognition as bidders for any future work with the Owner until such bidder has been reinstated as a qualified bidder.

2. Bid prices that obviously are unbalanced.
3. Lack of competency and adequate machinery, plant and other equipment, as revealed by experience questionnaires required by the Owner.
4. Machinery and/or equipment which does not conform to the specifications.
5. Failure to comply with any qualification or regulation of the Owner.
6. Performance of machinery and/or equipment which after evaluation in the opinion of the Township is not cost effective to operate and maintain on both short and long term basis.
7. If the proposal is on a form other than that furnished by the Owner or if the form is altered or any part thereof is detached.
8. If there are unauthorized additions, conditional or alternate bids, or irregularities of any kind which may tend to make the proposal incomplete, indefinite, or ambiguous as to its meaning.
9. If the bidder adds any provisions reserving the right to accept or reject an award, or to enter into a contract pursuant to an award. This does not exclude a bid limited to the maximum gross amount of award acceptable to any one bidder at any one bid letting, provided that any selection of awards will be made by the Owner.
10. If the proposal does not contain a unit price for each pay item listed, except in the case of authorized alternate pay items or lump sum items.
11. If the bidder fails to properly complete bid proposal forms.

**102.12 - OMISSIONS AND DISCREPANCIES** - Should a bidder find discrepancies or omissions in the Contract Documents or should he be in doubt as to their meaning, he should at once notify the Richard R. Rohn, Public Works Director, in writing or via email [rrohn@jacksontwp.com](mailto:rrohn@jacksontwp.com), who will evaluate the bidder's concerns and send written instructions to all Bidders in the form of an addendum, if necessary.

#### **102.13 - DEFINITIONS**

1. Owner/Township - Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio or their authorized representative.
2. Township Representative - shall be understood to mean the project representative employed or retained by the Owner and designated and authorized to act as its agent.
3. Inspector - shall be understood to mean the on-site project inspection representative employed or retained by the Owner and designated and authorized to act as its agent.
4. Bidder - is any person, firm or corporation submitting a Proposal for work contemplated.
5. Contractor - is any person, firm, or corporation undertaking work on an executed Contract.
6. Subcontractor - is any person, firm or corporation undertaking work under the obligation of the Contractor, who prior to such undertaking, received the written consent of the Owner.
7. Surety - is the corporate body individual (or individuals), bound with and for the Contractor for the acceptable performance of the Contract and for completion of the Work.



8. Proposal Form - is the approved form, bound with the specifications upon which the Owner required formal bids to be prepared and submitted for the Work.
9. Proposal - is the offer of the Bidder for the Work, made out and submitted on the prescribed Proposal Form, properly signed and guaranteed.
10. Specifications - are the directions, provisions, and requirements as contained herein or amended, pertaining to the method and manner of performing the work and the quantities and quality of materials to be furnished, and method of evaluating payments under the Contract.
11. Supplemental Agreements - are written agreements executed by the Contractor and the Owner covering alterations necessary to the project as hereinafter provided.
12. Contract - is the written agreement covering the performance of the Work and furnishing labor, tools, and equipment, and materials in construction of the Work. The Contract shall include Notice to Bidders, Proposal, Specifications, and Bonds and also all Supplemental Agreements, required to complete the Work in a substantial and acceptable manner.
13. Contract Bond - is the approved form of security furnished by the Contractor and his Surety or Sureties as a guaranty that he will complete the Work in accordance with the terms of the Contract, and all Supplemental Agreements pertaining thereto.
14. Work - is all work specified or indicated on the Proposal and Contract Specifications, Plans and Documents.

**102.14 - SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE WORK** - All work under this contract shall be performed in strict compliance with the most recent Ohio Building Codes, regulations of the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, and/or compliance with any other applicable local building or licensing authorities concerning State, Federal, and local agencies of Jackson Township.

1. Jackson Township Amphitheater LED Video Screen Plans & Specifications contain necessary construction details and are located in Section 102.25.

**102.15 - FAIR PROPOSALS** - Bidders are notified that in submitting their proposals, they thereby declare that all persons interested as principals are named therein and that the Proposal is fair in all respects; that it was prepared without collusion or fraud, and that no person in the employ of the Owner was or shall be interested in the performance of the Contract or in the supplies, work, or business to which it relates or in any portion of the profits therefrom.

**102.16 - STATE LAWS AND REGULATIONS** - The Bidder's attention is directed to all applicable State laws, rules and regulations of the authorities having jurisdiction over work in the locality of the project. They shall apply to the Contract throughout, as though herein written.

**102.17 - ACCEPTANCE OR REJECTION OF PROPOSALS** - The Owner reserves the right to waive informalities, to reject any or all bids or to accept other than the lowest bid. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Proposals which are incomplete, obscure, irregular, contain erasures, omit a bid price, fail to list subcontractors, or are accompanied by an insufficient or irregular certified check or bid bond, may be rejected. Any Proposal may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time for opening of bids or authorized postponement thereof. Any Proposal received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. A bid shall be held firm for a minimum of sixty (60) days from the time of bid opening.



**102.18 - AWARD OF CONTRACT** - The Estimate is established on the base bid. The Township, unless all bids are rejected, will award the Contract based on the lowest and best base price bidder.

On November 14, 2005, the Board of Trustees adopted the following Bid Criteria Resolution which is incorporated herein.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, pursuant to ORC Chapter 504 and ORC Sections 504.04(A)(1) and (2) or other law, that the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township:

(1) Hereby determines that the following factors are significant in determining whether a bid is the lowest and best bid and may be considered and applied by the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, in its discretion, to any contractor submitting a bid when awarding *all* competitively bid construction contracts:

- a. Bidder's familiarity with the project
- b. Adequacy of equipment for the project
- c. Bidder's record on similar construction projects
- d. Bidder's construction experience in the preceding twelve (12) months including the original contract price for each job undertaken, the cost of any change order and overruns
- e. Bidder's compliance with completion deadlines
- f. Bidder's prior performance on any project for Jackson Township
- g. Bidder's financial solvency
- h. Whether bidder has ever sued or been sued by a public entity over a public project
- i. Bidder's bonding record
- j. Bidder's compliance record with unemployment and workers' compensation laws
- k. Bidder's compliance record with Federal and State wage laws
- l. Bidder's compliance record with the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA)
- m. Bidder's compliance record with Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations
- n. Any other factor determined to be relevant by the Board of Trustees.

(2) Hereby determines, in certain circumstances, other factors are also significant in determining whether a bid is the lowest and best bid. These other factors may be considered and applied by the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, in its discretion, to the two lowest responsive bidders when the dollar amounts of the two lowest responsive bids are within the following limits of each other:

- a. 15% if the lowest bid is at least \$50,000 but does not exceed \$100,000,
- b. 10% if the lowest bid is at least \$100,000 but does not exceed \$500,000,
- c. 5% if the lowest bid exceeds \$500,000.

If one of these circumstances exist, the following other factors are also significant in determining whether a bid is the lowest and best bid and may be considered and applied by the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, in its discretion, to the two lowest responsive bidders:

Bid specifications shall contain provisions conforming to Sections 1 and 2 of this Resolution, including the attached bidder's profile form to enable a bidder to provide evidence to the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township for the bidder's compliance with, adherence to, or satisfaction of, the various factors that may be considered by the Board in determining the lowest and best bid.
- (4) This Resolution shall fully replace any prior Resolution establishing best bid criteria and is effective on December 14, 2005.

In order to make this determination, the Owner may make such investigations as necessary, and the Bidder shall furnish to the Owner all such information and data requested for this purpose, including experience, finances, equipment, and personnel. The Owner shall make such investigation as necessary into similar past contractual relationships of the Bidder, and the Bidder shall furnish to the Owner, all such information and data requested for this purpose.

**102.19 - CANCELLATION OF AWARD** - The Owner reserves the right to rescind the award of any Contract, before the execution of said Contract by all parties, without any liability against the Owner.

**102.20 - NOTICE OF AWARD** - The successful Bidder, within ten (10) days from the date of the Notice of Award, will be required to execute the contract and furnish the necessary Contractor's Performance Bond, and Certificate of Insurance as described below, and other information and certificates as required. Failure to do so will constitute an abandonment of the bid bond.

**102.21 - PERFORMANCE BOND** - If the Contractor submitted a bid guaranty described in Section 102.06 (2), the Contractor shall within ten (10) days after receipt of the Notice of Award, furnish the Owner with a Performance Bond in a penal sum equal to the amount of the Contract Price, conditioned upon the performance by the Contractor of all undertaking, covenants, terms, conditions, and agreements of the Contract Documents. 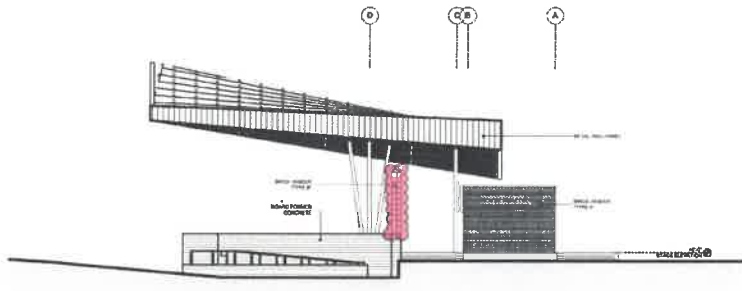

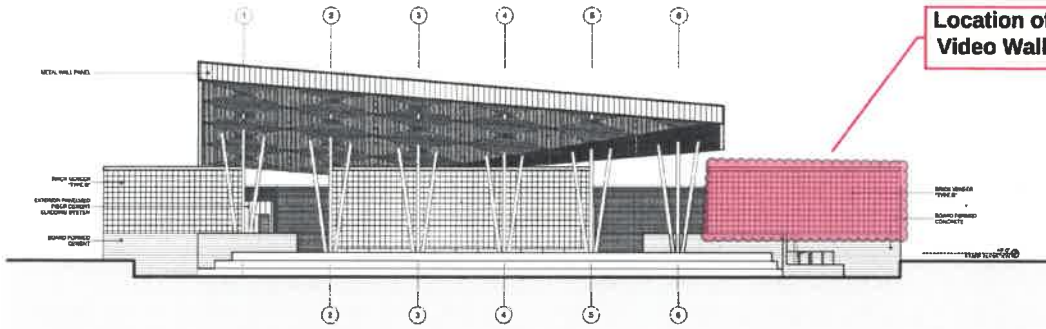

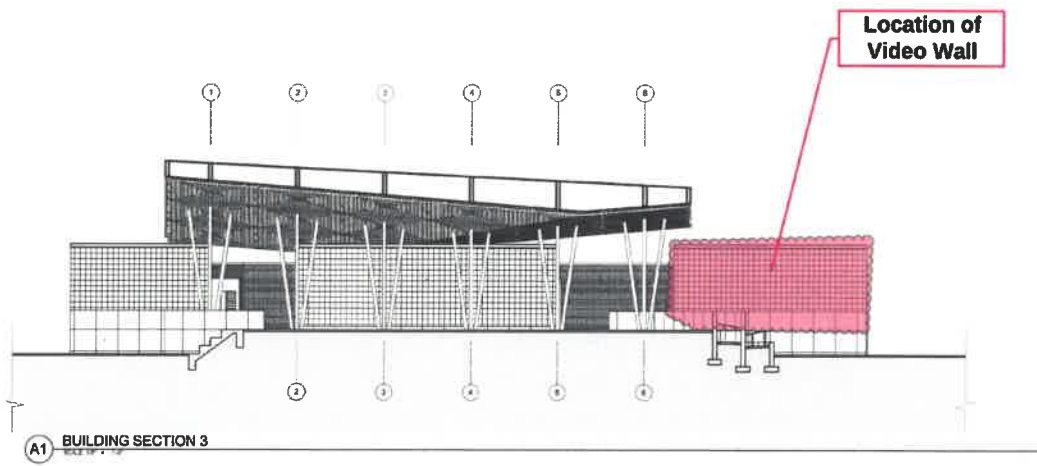

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into at Jackson Township, Ohio, by the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township (hereafter Township), and (hereafter Contractor).

WITNESS, the Township and the Contractor hereby agree as follows:

### **1. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS**

The Contract consists of this document, the Advertisement for Bids, the Drawings, Specifications and all Addenda issued prior to the execution of this contract, the Performance Bond, the Contractor's Bid, this Contract, all Change Orders issued subsequent thereto, and Prevailing Rate Wages.

### **2. CONTRACT REGULATIONS**

Terms and conditions of this Contract shall be governed by the provisions of Chapters 153, 505 and 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code and all other applicable local, State, and Federal ordinances, statutes and regulations. All records, manuals, forms, drawings, schedules, lists, surveys, specifications, designs, and other data pertaining to the work specified in this Contract are and shall remain the sole property of the Township.

### **3. NON-DISCRIMINATION**

Each subcontractor shall require all lower-tier subcontractors with whom the subcontractor is in contract for the public improvement to be enrolled in and be in good standing in the Bureau of Workers' Compensation's Drug-Free Workplace Program or a comparable program approved by the Bureau that meets the requirements specified in section 153.03 of the Revised Code prior to a lower-tier subcontractor providing labor at the project site of the public improvement.

#### INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Certificates in triplicate from the insurance carrier stating the limits of liability and expiration date shall be filed with the Owner before operations begin. Such certificates shall not merely name the types of policy provided, but shall specifically refer to this Contract and shall contain a separate express statement of compliance with each of the requirements as set forth in this section. However, the original policy for Owner's Protective Bodily Injury (Item F) and Property Damages (Item G) shall at this time be delivered to the Owner for their possession.

The Coverage shall include all items mentioned to satisfy the Indemnification Clause included herein. The coverage shall include Underground Hazards for sub-surface operations, explosion, and collapse liability coverage.

The Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio shall be named as an additional insured in this coverage.

The minimum limits of liability shall be as follows, unless otherwise specifically required by special provisions in the specifications or this Contract.

- Item A - Workmen's Compensation and/or Employer Liability Insurance as required or specified by State Law.

SECTION 105

GENERAL CONDITIONS

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**105.01 - AUTHORITY OF THE TOWNSHIP REPRESENTATIVE** - The Township Representative shall be understood to mean the project representative employed or retained by the Owner and designated and authorized to act as its agent during the construction period. The Township Representative shall act as the Owner's representative during the construction period. He shall decide questions which may arise as to quality and acceptability of material furnished and work performed. He shall interpret the intent of the Contract Documents in a fair and unbiased manner. The Township Representative shall determine if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents and shall have the authority to suspend the work wholly or in part due to the failure of the Contractor to so comply. A notification of unacceptable workmanship and/or materials is to be given the Contractor and Inspector, or their representatives, as soon as the irregularities are recognized. The Inspector is not authorized to alter or waive provisions of the Contract, or to issue instructions contrary to the specifications.

**105.03 - INSPECTION OF WORK** - All materials and equipment and each part or detail of the work shall be subject to inspection by the Inspector. No materials shall be used until approved by the Inspector. The Inspector shall be allowed access to all parts of the work and shall be furnished with such information and assistance by the Contractor as required to make a complete and detailed inspection. If requested, the Contractor shall cooperate with the Inspector in the inspection of materials and equipment at the source of manufacturing facility. At the Inspector's request, the Contractor, at any time before acceptance of the work, shall remove or uncover such portions of the finished work as directed. After examination, the Contractor shall restore the work to the standard required by the specifications. Should the work thus exposed or examined prove acceptable, uncovering or removing and the recovering or replacement of the parts removed, will be paid for as extra work. Should the work so exposed or examined prove unacceptable, the uncovering or removing and recovering or replacement of the parts removed, will be at the Contractor's expense. Any work done or materials and equipment used without supervision or inspection by the Inspector may be ordered removed and replaced at the Contractor's expense. Failure to reject any defective work or material shall not in any way prevent later rejection when such defects are discovered, or obligate the Owner to final acceptance.

**105.04 - REMOVAL OF UNACCEPTABLE AND UNAUTHORIZED WORK** - All work which does not conform to the requirements of the Contract may be considered as unacceptable work. Unacceptable work, whether the result of poor workmanship, use of defective materials, damage through carelessness, or any other cause, found to exist prior to the final acceptance of the work, shall be removed immediately and replaced in an acceptable manner.

**105.05 - SUPERVISION BY THE CONTRACTOR** - The Contractor will employ and provide a qualified supervisor or superintendent who shall be designated in writing by the Contractor, as the Contractor's representative at the site. The supervisor shall have full authority to act on behalf of the Contractor. All communications given to the supervisor shall be as binding as if given to the Contractor. The supervisor shall be present on the site at all times during the prosecution of the work to supervise and coordinate the work. The Township Representative will have authority to Suspend work at any time, until such supervision is provided. It is expected that the supervisor will attend the pre-construction meeting.

**105.06 - CHARACTER OF WORKMEN** - The Contractor shall at all times provide sufficient equipment and competent labor to complete the work required by these specifications. All workmen shall have sufficient skill and experience to perform properly the work assigned. Workmen engaged in special skilled work shall have sufficient experience in such work and in the operation of equipment required to perform all work properly and satisfactorily. Any person employed by the Contractor or by any subcontractor who, in the opinion of the Township Representative, does not perform his work in a proper and skillful manner or is intemperate or disorderly, shall, at the written request of the Township Representative, be removed by the Contractor or subcontractor employing such person, and shall not be employed again in any portion of the work without the approval of the Township Representative. Should the Contractor fail to remove such person or persons as required above, or fail to furnish suitable and sufficient personnel for the proper prosecution of the work, the Township Representative may withhold all estimates which are or may become due, or may suspend the work by written notice until the Contractor complies with such orders.

**105.07 - SUBCONTRACTING** - The Contractor may utilize the service of specialty subcontractors on those parts of the work which, under normal contracting practices, are performed by specialty subcontractors, including manufacturing, installation and delivery. The Contractor shall be fully responsible, to the Owner, for the acts and omissions of his subcontractors, and of persons either directly or indirectly employed by him, as if directly employed by him. The Contractor shall cause appropriate provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts relative to the work. These provisions shall bind subcontractors to the Contractor for the terms of the Contract Documents, insofar as applicable to the work of subcontractors, and shall give the Contractor the same terminating authority over any subcontract that the Owner may exercise over the Contractor, under provisions of the Contract Documents. Nothing contained in this Contract shall create any contractual relation between any Subcontractor or the Owner. No subcontract, or transfer of contract, shall in any cause release the Contractor of his liability under the Contracts and bonds.

**105.08 - MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITY OF CONTRACTORS** - The Contractor shall assume all liability, financial or otherwise, for acts of the Contractor which cause any other Contractor, Subcontractor, or consultant to suffer damage, inconvenience, delay or loss on the project. The Owner shall notify the Contractor of any claims asserted against the Owner on account of any such damage, inconvenience, delay, or loss alleged to have been caused by the Contractor who shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner against any such claim.

**105.09 - DRAWINGS** - The Construction Drawings shall be considered a part of the Contract Documents and shall take priority over anything written or implied herein.

**105.10 - DRAWINGS AND SPECIFICATIONS** - The Owner will furnish the Contractor one (1) sets of detailed drawings and specifications at no charge. One (1) set shall be available at the construction site at all times. All specifications, details and copies thereof furnished by the Township Representative are the property of the Owner. They are not to be used on other work and, with the exception of the Contract set, are to be returned to the Owner upon request. Any additional detailed drawings and instruction supplies will become a part of the Contract Documents.

**105.11 - COORDINATION OF PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, SUPPLEMENTAL SPECIFICATIONS, AND SPECIAL PROVISIONS** - The specifications, supplemental specifications, plans, special provisions, and all supplementary documents are essential parts of the Contract, and a requirement occurring in one is as binding as though occurring in all. They are intended to be complimentary. In case of discrepancy, calculated dimensions will govern over scaled dimensions; specifications will govern over plans, supplemental specifications will govern over specifications; and special conditions will govern over specifications and plans.

The Contractor shall not take advantage of any apparent error or omission in the plans or specifications. In the event the Contractor discovers an error, omission, or discrepancy, he shall immediately notify the Township Representative. The Township Representative will make such corrections and interpretations as necessary to comply with the intent of the plans and specifications. The Contractor shall not begin work after his discovery of such discrepancies, inconsistencies or ambiguities until the Township Representative has corrected same. Any unsatisfactory work will be removed.

**105.12 - LANDS AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY** - Prior to issuance of Notice to Proceed, the Owner shall obtain all land rights-of-way necessary for the completion of the work unless otherwise indicated in the Contract Documents. The Owner shall provide, to the Contractor, information which delineates and describes the lands owned and rights-of-way acquired. The Contractor shall provide, at his own expense and without liability to the Owner, any additional land and access thereto that the Contractor may desire for temporary construction, or for storage of materials.

**105.13 - NIGHT WORK** - All work on this Contract, unless otherwise stated on the plans, will be limited to the daylight hours except in cases of emergency as determined by the Township Representative. Adequate lighting facilities shall be used for night work.

**105.14 - SATURDAY, SUNDAY OR HOLIDAY WORK** - No work will be permitted on Saturdays, Sundays or Holidays, except in case of emergency as determined by the Township Representative.

**105.15 - SUSPENSION OF WORK - EXTENSIONS OF TIME** - If the Township Representative should suspend the work in whole or in part, due to no fault of the Contractor, or add additional work, the date for completion shall be extended the number of days that the suspension or additional work directly or indirectly delays the completion of the work. The Township Representative shall determine the number of days for time extension purposes. If the Contractor disagrees with the Township Representative on the time extension allowed, he shall, within thirty (30) days file written objection and proof of his claim for additional time extension. The failure to file a written objection, within the thirty (30) day limit will constitute an acceptance of the Township Representative's determination.

No claim for damages or any claim other than for an extension of time as herein provided shall be made or asserted against the Owner by reason for any of the delays herein before mentioned.

**105.16 - PERMITS AND LICENSES** - Permits and licenses of a temporary nature necessary for the prosecution of the work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor unless otherwise stated in the Special Conditions. Permits and licenses for permanent structures or permanent changes in existing facilities shall be paid for by the Owner. The Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations as required.

**105.17 - TAXES** - The Township is exempt from the payment of the Ohio Sales and Use Tax, the cost of such is not to be included in the proposal.

**105.18 - MEASUREMENT OF QUANTITIES** - Where work is to be paid for by units of length, area, weight, or volume, all work accepted under this Contract shall be determined by the Township Representative, and the quantities determined by the Township Representative shall be the basis for final payment. When computation of area by geometric methods would be comparatively laborious, the planimeter shall be considered an instrument of precision adapted to the measurement of such areas. Method of measurement shall be determined by the Township Representative. If the "Basis of Payment" clause in the specifications stipulates the price shall be considered compensation for work or materials essential to the item, this same work or material will not be paid for under any

other item. Should a conflict occur in the specifications, the Township Representative shall determine under which item the work will be paid.

**105.19 - ALTERATION OF PLANS OR CHARACTER OF WORK** - The Owner reserves the right to make, at any time during the progress of the work, such increases or decreases in quantities and such alterations in the details of construction, including alterations in the grade or alignment of the road, structure, or sewers, as may be found to be necessary or desirable, such increases or decreases and alterations shall not invalidate the contract nor release the surety, and the Contractor agrees to perform the work as altered, the same as if it had been a part of the original contract.

Unless such alterations and increases or decreases materially change the character of the work to be performed or the cost thereof, the altered work shall be paid for at the same unit prices as other parts of the work. No claim shall be made by the Contractor for any loss of anticipated profits because of any such alteration, or by reason of any variation between the approximate quantities and the quantities of work as done. Payments shall be in accordance with 105.22. If, however, the character of the work on the unit costs thereof are materially changed, an allowance shall be made on such basis as may have been agreed to in advance of the performance of the work, or in case no such basis has been previously agreed upon, then an allowance shall be made, either for or against the Contractor, in such amount as the Owner may determine to be fair and equitable.

Should the Contractor encounter or the Owner discover during the progress of the work, subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site differing materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the contract, the Township Representative shall be promptly notified in writing of such conditions before they are disturbed. The Township Representative will thereupon promptly investigate the conditions and if he finds they do so materially differ and cause an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for performance of the contract, an equitable adjustment will be made.

Any adjustment in compensation because of a change or changes resulting from one or more of the conditions described in the foregoing paragraph will be made in accordance with the provisions of 105.20. Any adjustment in contract time because of changes will be made in accordance with the provisions of 105.37.

**105.20 - EXTRA WORK** - The Contractor shall perform unforeseen work, for which there is no price included in the contract, whenever it is deemed necessary or desirable in order to complete fully the work as contemplated. Such work shall be performed in accordance with ORC Section 153.62 and these specifications and will be paid for as provided under 105.21.

**105.21 - PAYMENT FOR EXTRA WORK** - Extra work performed in accordance with the requirements and provisions of 105.20 will be paid for at the unit prices or lump sum stipulated in the order authorizing the work.

**105.22 - COMPENSATION FOR ALTERED QUANTITIES** - When the accepted quantities of work vary from the quantities in the bid schedule, the Contractor shall accept as payment in full, so far as contract items are concerned, payment at the original contract unit prices for the accepted quantities of work done. No allowance except as provided in 105.19 will be made for any increased expense, loss expected reimbursement, or loss of anticipated profits suffered or claimed by the contractor resulting either directly from such alterations or indirectly from unbalanced allocation among the contract items of overhead expense on the part of the Bidder and subsequent loss of expected reimbursements therefor or from any other cause.

Increased work involving supplemental agreements shall be paid for as stipulated in such agreements. The Contractor shall furnish substantiating data required in the preparation of these agreements.

**105.23 - ELIMINATED ITEMS** - Should any items contained in the work proposal be found unnecessary for the proper completion of the work, the Township Representative may, upon written order to the Contractor, eliminate such items from the contract, and such action shall in no way invalidate the contract. When a Contractor is notified of the elimination of items, he will be reimbursed for actual work done and costs incurred. Any work done after notification will not be paid for unless directed by the Township Representative.

**105.24 - RESPONSIBILITY FOR DAMAGE CLAIMS** - The Contractor and Surety shall save harmless the Owner, all of its representatives and participating utilities, from all suits, actions, or claims of any nature due to any injuries or damages sustained by any person or to property due to neglect in safeguarding the work or through the use of unacceptable materials in the construction or on account of any act or omission by the Contractor, or his agents.

**105.25 - PAYMENT TO THE CONTRACTOR** - At least ten (10) days before each progress payment date, but not more often than once a month, the Contractor will submit to the Inspector a partial payment estimate, completed and signed by the Contractor, covering the work performed during the partial payment period. The estimate shall be supported by such data as the Inspector may reasonably require. If payment is requested on the basis of materials and equipment not incorporated in the work but delivered and suitably stored at or near the site, the partial payment estimates shall also be accompanied by such supporting data, satisfactory to the Owner. The request shall be accompanied by proper invoices and proof of payment, which will establish the Owner's title to the material and equipment and protect his interest therein, including applicable insurance. The Inspector will, within ten (10) days after receipt of each partial estimate, either indicate in writing his approval of payment and present the partial payment estimate to the Owner, or return the partial payment estimate to the Contractor indicating in writing his reasons for refusing to approve payment. In the latter case, the Contractor may make the necessary corrections and resubmit the partial payment estimate. The Owner will normally, within thirty (30) days of presentation to him of the approved partial payment estimate, pay the Contractor on the basis of the approved partial payment estimate. The Contractor will be paid the stipulated unit and lump sum prices set forth in his proposal, for the amount of work approved for payment.

The cost of handling and placing all materials after they are delivered to the Contractor shall be included in the contract price for the item. The Contractor will be responsible for all material delivered and deductions will be made from any monies due for shortages and deficiencies, and for any damage which may occur after such delivery. The Owner shall retain eight percent (8%) of the amount of each partial payment until the work is fifty percent (50%) complete. All remaining partial payments will be made in full. After the work is fifty percent (50%) complete, all retainage made will be placed in escrow, and will remain there until the work is complete and accepted. After completion and acceptance, the retainage and accumulated interest shall be paid to the Contractor from the escrow account.

**105.26 - PAYMENTS BY THE CONTRACTOR** - The Contractor shall pay:

1. All transportation and utility services no later than thirty (30) days following receipt of proper invoices.
2. All materials, tools and other expendable equipment. Payment shall be one hundred percent



(100%) less retainage held by the Owner from the Contractor as indicated in Section 105.25. Payment shall be made no later than thirty (30) days after receipt of proper invoices. The balance of the cost thereof not later than thirty (30) days following acceptance of that part of the work in or on which such materials, tools, and equipment were incorporated.

3. Each of his Subcontractors, not later than ten (10) days following receipt of proper invoices and payment to the Contractor by the Owner, for work performed by the Subcontractor.

**105.27 - FINAL CLEANING UP** - Before final acceptance, all ground occupied by the Contractor in connection with the work shall be cleaned of all rubbish, excess materials, temporary structures, and equipment, and all parts of the work shall be left in an acceptable condition. Where the Contractor has occupied private property, he shall obtain a written statement from the property Owner indicating the premises have been left in an acceptable condition. Copies must be submitted with final estimate.

**105.28 - FINAL INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE** - When the work has been completed, the Inspector will make a pre-final inspection. If items must be completed or remedied by the Contractor, he shall perform the work immediately upon being notified by the Inspector. When these items have been corrected by the Contractor, final inspection will be made. The work must pass final inspection by the Inspector prior to acceptance by the Owner.

**105.29 - FINAL ESTIMATE** - Before the final estimate is approved, the Owner will require the Contractor to submit an affidavit from each Subcontractor verifying that all claims and obligations, arising in connection with the performance of his portion of the Contract, have been satisfied. If the Inspector finds the work acceptable, he shall, within thirty (30) days after the final inspection and acceptance of the work, prepare a statement of acceptability, and the Owner shall pay the entire sum so found to be due hereunder, after deducting all previous payments and all amounts to be retained. All prior partial estimates and payments shall be subject to correction in the certificate of "TOTAL COST". No payment shall be made for unauthorized work. The date of approval of the final estimate by the Owner shall be the date of acceptance for that project. The Owner shall not be precluded or estopped by any return or certificate made or given by it from showing at any time either before or after the final completion and acceptance of the work and payment therefore, pursuant to any such return or certificate, the true and correct amount and character of the work done and materials furnished by the Contractor or any other person under this agreement, or from showing at any item that the work and materials, or any part thereof do not conform to the specifications; and the Owner shall not be precluded or estopped, notwithstanding any such return or certificate and payment in accordance therewith from demanding and recovering from the Contractor such damages as it may sustain by reason of his failure to comply with the specifications. The Contractor will indemnify and save the Owner or the Owner's agents harmless from all claims growing out of the lawful demands of Subcontractors, laborers, workmen, mechanics, suppliers, etc., incurred in the performance of the work. If the Contractor fails to pay his Subcontractors or suppliers, the Owner may, after having notified the Contractor, either pay valid claims or withhold monies due the Contractor, a sum deemed reasonably sufficient to pay any and all such lawful claims until satisfactory evidence is furnished that all liabilities have been fully discharged in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents. In no case shall the provisions of this Section be construed to impose any obligations upon the Owner to either the Contractor, his Surety, or any third party. If the Owner chooses to pay the valid claims, any payment so made, shall be considered as payment to the Contractor for any such payments.

**105.30 - ACCEPTANCE OF FINAL PAYMENT CONSTITUTES RELEASE** - The acceptance by the Contractor of Final Payment shall constitute a release to the Owner for all claims and liability arising out of this work, excepting the Contractor's claims for interest upon the Final Payment if this payment

is improperly delayed. No payment, final or otherwise, shall release the Contractor or his Sureties from obligations under this Contract, or Performance Bond. Prior to Substantial Completion, the Owner, with the approval of the Inspector, and with the concurrence of the Contractor, may use any completed or substantially completed date certified by the Inspector when the construction of the project or specified part thereof is sufficiently completed in accordance with the Contract Documents, so that the project or specified part can be utilized for the purposes for which it was intended. Use shall not constitute an acceptance of the work.

**105.31 - CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION** - Upon completion of all work required, the Inspector shall file a written certificate, within the Owner and with the Contractor, determining the amount of work performed and compensation due the Contractor, including extra work and/or reduction of work.

**105.32 - ASSIGNMENTS** - Neither the Contractor nor the Owner shall sell, transfer, assign or otherwise dispose of the Contract or any portion thereof, or of his right, title or interest therein, or his obligations thereunder, without written consent of the other party.

**105.33 - DISPUTE RESOLUTION** - All claims, counterclaims, disputes and other matters in question arising out of, or relating to the Contract Documents or their breach, except for claims which have been waived by the making and acceptance of final payment, will be decided by submission to a court of competent jurisdiction within the State or, if the parties mutually agree, in accordance with the Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association.

**105.34 - ACCESS TO RECORDS** -

1. The Contractor shall maintain books, records, documents and other evidence directly pertinent to performance of the work under this agreement in accordance with the accepted professional practice, and appropriate accounting procedures and practices. The Township of Jackson or any of their duly authorized representatives shall have access to such books, records, documents, and other evidence for the purpose of inspection, audit, and copying. The Contractor will provide proper facilities for such access and inspection.
2. The Contractor agrees to include the five items of this Section 105.34 in all contracts and subcontracts which relate directly to project performance, and exceed \$10,000.00 in cost.
3. Audits conducted pursuant to this provision shall be in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and formally established audit regulations, procedures, and guidelines of the reviewing or audit agency(ies).
4. The Contractor agrees to the disclosure of all information and reports resulting from access to records pursuant to paragraphs 1 and 2 above, to any of the agencies referred to in paragraph 1 above. In those cases where the audit concerns the Contractor, the auditing agency will afford the Contractor an opportunity for an audit exit conference, and an opportunity to comment on the pertinent portions of the draft audit report. The Contractor will be provided copies of the formal draft audit report at the time of its transmission. Such transmission will include the written comments, if any, of the audited firm.
5. Records under paragraphs 1 and 2 above shall be maintained and made available during performance of the work under this agreement and until three (3) years from the date of final payment for the project. In addition, those records which relate to any dispute, or appeal or litigation, or the settlement of claims arising out of such performance, or the costs or items to which an audit exception has been taken, shall be maintained and made available until three

(3) days after the date of resolution of such appeal, litigation, claim or exception.

**105.35 - TIME OF COMPLETION AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES -**

1. Time is of the essence. The date of beginning and the time for completion of the work are essential conditions of the Contract Documents and the work embraced shall be commenced on a date specified in the Notice to Proceed.
2. The Contractor will proceed with the work at such rate of progress to insure full completion within the contract time. It is expressly understood and agreed, by and between the Contractor and the Owner, that the contract time for the completion of the work described herein is a reasonable time, taking into consideration the average climatic and economic conditions and other factors prevailing in the locality of the work.
3. If the Contractor shall fail to reach substantial completion within the contract time, or be granted an extension of time by the Owner, then the Contractor will pay as liquidated damages to the Owner the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per calendar day.
4. The Contractor shall not be charged with liquidated damages or any excess cost when the delay in completion of the work is due to the following, and the Contractor has promptly given written notice of such delay to the Owner or Inspector:
  - A. To unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, including, but not restricted to acts of God, or of the public enemy, acts of the Owner, acts of another Contractor in the performance of a contract with the Owner, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and abnormal and unforeseeable weather.

**105.36 - TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT; DAMAGES FOR DELAY, TIME EXTENSIONS**

1. If the Contractor refuses or fails to prosecute the work, or any separable part of the work, which such diligence as will insure its completion within the time specified in this contract, or any extension thereof, or fails to complete said work within such time, the Owner may, by written notice to the Contractor, terminate his right to proceed with the work or such part of the work as to which there has been delay. In such event the Owner may take over the work and prosecute the same to completion, by contract or otherwise, and may take possession of and use any part of the work, such materials, appliances, and plant as may be on the site of the work and necessary therefore. Whether or not the Contractor's right to proceed with the work is terminated, he and his Sureties shall be liable for any damage to the Owner resulting from his refusal or failure to complete the work within the specified time.
2. If the contract provides for liquidated damages, and if the Owner terminates the Contractor's right to proceed, the resulting damage to the Owner will consist of such liquidated damages until such reasonable time as may be required for final completion of the work together with any increased costs the Owner incurs in completing the work.
3. If the contract provides for liquidated damages and if the Owner does not terminate the Contractor's right to proceed, the resulting damage will consist of such liquidated damages until the work is completed or accepted.
4. The Contractor's right to proceed shall not be terminated nor the Contractor charged with

resulting damage if:

- A. The delay in the completion of the work arises from causes other than normal weather beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, including, but not restricted to acts of God, acts of the public enemy, acts of the Owner in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, acts of another Contractor in the performance of a contract with the Owner, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine, strikes, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather, or delays of Subcontractors or suppliers arising from causes other than normal weather beyond the control and without the fault of negligence of both the Contractor and such Subcontractors or suppliers; and
- B. The Contractor, within ten (10) days from the beginning of any such delay, (unless the Owner grants a further period of time before the date of payment under the contract), notifies the Owner in writing of the causes of delay. The Owner shall ascertain the facts and the extent of the delay and extend the time for completing the work when, in the Owner's judgment, the findings of fact justify such an extension. His findings of fact shall be final and conclusive on the parties, subject only to appeal as the remedies clause of this contract provides.

(1) No claim for damages or any claim other than for an extension of time as herein provided shall be made or asserted against the Owner by reasons of any of the delays herein before mentioned.

- 5. If, after the notice of termination of the Contractor's right to proceed under the provisions of this clause, it is determined for any reason that the Contractor was not in default under this clause, or that the delay was excusable under this clause, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the notice of termination has been issued under the clause providing for termination for convenience of the Owner.
- 6. The rights and remedies of the Owner provided in this clause are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this contract.
- 7. As used in Paragraph (4)(A) of this clause, the term "Subcontractors or suppliers" means Subcontractors or suppliers at any tier.

#### **105.37 - TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE**

- 1. The Owner may terminate the performance of work under this contract in accordance with this clause in whole, or from time to time in part, whenever the Owner shall determine that such termination is in the best interest of the Owner. Any such termination shall be effected by delivery to the Contractor of a notice of termination specifying the extent to which performance of work under the contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.
- 2. After receipt of a notice of termination, and except as otherwise directed by the Owner, the Contractor shall:
  - A. Stop work under the contract on the date and to the extent specified in the notice of termination;
  - B. Place no further orders or subcontracts for materials, services or facilities except as

necessary to complete the portion of the work under the contract which is not terminated;

- C. Terminate all orders and subcontracts to the extent that they relate to the performance of work terminated by the notice of termination.
  - D. Assign to the Owner, in the manner, at the time, and to the extent directed by the Owner, all of the right, title, and interest of the Contractor under the orders and subcontractors so terminated.
    - (1) The Owner shall have the right in its discretion, to settle or pay any or all claims arising out of the termination of such orders and subcontracts;
  - E. Settle all outstanding liabilities and all claims arising out of such termination of orders and subcontracts, with the approval or ratification of the Owner to the extent he may require. His approval or ratification shall be final for all the purposes of this clause;
  - F. Transfer title to the Owner, and deliver in the manner, at the times, and to the extent, if any, directed by the Owner:
    - (1) the fabricated or unfabricated parts, work in process, completed work, supplies, and other material produced as part of the work terminated by the notice of termination; and
    - (2) the completed or partially completed plans, drawings, information, and other property which, if the contract had been completed, would have been required to be furnished to the Owner;
  - G. Use his best efforts to sell, in the manner, at the times, to the extent, and at the price or prices that the Owner directs or authorizes, any property of the types referred to in paragraph (2)(F) of this clause, but the Contractor
    - (1) shall not be required to extend credit to any purchaser, and
    - (2) may acquire any such property under the conditions prescribed and at a price or prices approved by the Owner. The proceeds of any such transfer or disposition shall be applied in reduction of any payments to be made by the price or cost of the work covered by this contract or paid in such other manner as the Owner may direct;
  - H. Complete performance of such part of the work as shall not have been terminated by the notice of termination; and
  - I. Take such action as may be necessary, or as the Owner may direct, for the protection and preservation of the property related to this contract which is in the possession of the Contractor and in which the Owner has or may acquire an interest.
3. After receipt of a notice of termination, the Contractor shall submit to the Owner his termination claim, in the form and with the certification the Owner prescribes. Such claim shall be submitted promptly but in no event later than one (1) year from the effective date of termination, unless one or more extensions in writing are granted by the Owner upon request of the Contractor made in writing within such one (1) year period of authorized extension.

However, if the Owner determines that the facts justify such action, he may receive and act upon any such termination claim at any time after such one (1) year period or extension. If the Contractor fails to submit this termination claim within the time allowed, the Owner may determine, on the basis of information available to him, the amount, if any, due to the Contractor because of the termination. The Owner shall then pay to the Contractor the amount so determined.

4. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 3, the Contractor and the Owner may agree upon the whole any part of the amount or amounts to be paid to the Contractor because of the total or partial termination of work under this clause. The amount or amounts may include a reasonable allowance for profit on work done. However, such agreed amount or amounts, exclusive of settlement costs, shall not exceed the total contract price as reduced by the amount of payments otherwise made and as further reduced by the contract price of work not terminated. The contract shall be amended accordingly, and the Contractor shall be paid the agreed amount. Nothing in paragraph 5 of this clause, prescribing the amount to be paid to the Contractor in the event of failure of the Contractor and the Owner to agree upon the whole amount to be paid to the Contractor because of the termination of work under this clause, shall be deemed to limit, restrict, or otherwise determine or effect the amount or amounts which may be agreed upon to be paid to the Contractor.
5. If the Contractor and the Owner fail to agree, as paragraph 4 provides, on the whole amount to be paid to the Contractor because of the termination of work under this clause, the Owner shall determine, on the basis of information available to him, the amount, if any, due to the Contractor by reason of the termination and shall pay to the Contractor the amounts determined as follows:
  - A. For all contract work performed before the effective date of the notice of termination, the total (without duplication of any items) of:
    - (1) The cost of such work; and
    - (2) The cost of settling and paying claims arising out of the termination of work under subcontracts or orders as paragraph (2)(E) of this clause provides. This cost is exclusive of the amounts paid or payable on account of supplies or materials delivered or services furnished by the Subcontractor before the effective date of the notice of termination. These amounts shall be included in the cost on account of which payment is made under paragraph (A)(1) of this section; and
    - (3) A sum, as profit on paragraph (A)(1) that the Owner determines to be fair and reasonable. But, if it appears that the Contractor would have sustained a loss on the entire contract had it been completed, no profit shall be included or allowed under this paragraph (A)(3) and an appropriate adjustment shall be made reducing the amount of the settlement to reflect the indicated rate of loss; and
  - B. The reasonable cost of the preservation and protection of property incurred under paragraph (2)(I) of this clause; and any other reasonable cost incidental to termination of work under this contract, including expense incidental to the determination of the amount due to the Contractor as the result of the termination of work under this contract. The total sum to be paid to the Contractor under paragraph (5)(A) of this

clause shall not exceed the total contract price as reduced by the amount of payments otherwise made and as further reduced by the contract price of work not terminated. Except for normal spoilage, and except to the extent that the Owner shall have otherwise expressly assumed the risk of loss, there shall be excluded from the amounts payable to the Contractor under paragraph (A), the fair value, as determined by the Owner of property which is destroyed, lost, stolen, or damaged, to the extent that it is undeliverable to the Owner, or to a buyer under paragraph (2)(G) of this clause.

6. The Contractor shall have the right to dispute under the clause of this contract entitled "Remedies" from any determination the Owner makes under paragraphs (3) or (5) of this clause. But, if the Contractor has failed to submit his claim within the time provided in paragraph (3) of this clause and has failed to request extension of such time, he shall have no such right of appeal. In any case where the Owner has determined the amount due under paragraph (3) or (5) of this clause, the Owner shall pay to the Contractor the following:
  - A. If there is no right of appeal hereunder or if no timely appeal has been taken, the amount so determined by the Owner or
  - B. Of a "Remedies" proceeding is initiated, the amount finally determined in such "Remedies" proceeding.
7. In arriving at the amount due the Contractor under this clause, there shall be deducted:
  - A. All unliquidated advance or other payments on account theretofore made to the Contractor, applicable to the termination portion of this contract.
  - B. Any claim which the Owner may have against the Contractor in connection with this contract, and
  - C. The agreed price for, or the proceeds of sale of, any materials, supplies, or other things kept by the Contractor or sold under the provisions of this clause, and not otherwise recovered by or credited to the Owner.
8. If the termination hereunder be partial, before the settlement of the terminated portion of this contract, the Contractor may file with the Owner a request in writing for an equitable adjustment of the price or prices specified in the contract relating to the continued portion of the contract (the portion not terminated by the notice of termination). Such equitable adjustment as may be agreed upon shall be made in the price or prices. Nothing contained herein shall limit the right of the Owner and the Contractor to agree upon the amount or amounts to be paid to the Contractor for the completion of the continued portion of the contract when the contract does not contain an established contract price for the continued portion.

**105.38 - INDEMNIFICATION CLAUSE** - The Contractor agrees to indemnify and save the Township, its' officials, officers, agents and employees harmless from any and all losses, claims, actions, costs, expenses, judgments, subrogation or other damages resulting from injury to any person (including injury resulting in death), or damage (including loss or destruction) to property of whatsoever nature of any person, firm, or corporation arising out of the errors, omissions or negligent acts of the Contractor in the performance of the terms of this contract by the Contractor, including but not limited to the Contractor's employees, agents, subcontractors, sub-subcontractors, and others designated by the Contractor to perform work or services in, about, or attendant to, the work, and services under

the terms of this Contract.

**105.39 - INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS** - The insurance requirements described in the Construction Contract and Exhibit A attached thereto (Section 104.02), are incorporated herein. The Contractor shall comply with these requirements.

**105.40 - UNDERGROUND UTILITIES (Section 153.64 ORC)** - The prime contractor(s), so identified in the Underground Utility Facilities section of the specifications, shall, at least two (2) working days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, prior to commencing construction operations in the Project area which may involve underground utility facilities, cause notice to be given to the Registered Underground Utility Services ("Services") and the owners of underground utility facilities shown on the plans and specifications who are not members of such Services, in writing, by telephone, or in person. Where notice is given in writing by certified mail, the return receipt signed by any person to whom the notice is delivered, shall be conclusive proof of notice.

The Owner of the underground utility facility shall within forty-eight (48) hours, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, after notice is received, stake, mark, or otherwise designate the location of the underground utility facilities in the construction area in such a manner as to indicate their course together with the approximate depth at which they were installed. The marking or locating shall be coordinated to stay approximately two (2) days ahead of the planned construction.

The contractor shall alert immediately the occupants of nearby premises as to any emergency that he may create or discover at or near such premises. The contractor shall report immediately to the owner or operator of the underground facility any break or lead on its lines or any dent, gouge, groove, or other damage to such lines or their coating of cathodic protection, made or discovered in the course of their excavation.

The prime contractor(s), so identified in the specification, regardless of his subcontractors at any tier, is solely responsible for complying with these requirements for underground utility facilities in the project area.
