The term excludes one or more turbines/solar panels as associated facilities that are primarily dedicated to providing electricity to a single customer at a single location and that are designed for, or capable of, operation at an aggregate capacity of less than twenty megawatts, as measured at the customers point of interconnection to the electrical grid, and;

Public Speaks –Merry Rini, 5064 High Mill Ave. NW, is concerned about the traffic, accidents, motorcycles and trucks near the intersection of High Mill and Lafayette (SR 236). She said lowering the road years ago has not helped the situation. The semi-truck traffic starts before 6 am and goes until 4 pm traveling to and from the gravel pit, approximately twelve trucks each hour. She said there have been eleven accidents in the past four years, five of them involving entrapments or injuries. She asked about large trucks traveling on the streets of a residential neighborhood. When the weather breaks, the motorcycle traffic begins. After leaving the Towpath Inn on Erie St., the motorcycles sit at the stop sign on High Mill in front of her home and rev their engines.

Pizzino asked Ms. Rini to clarify the routes the trucks are taking to and from the gravel pit on Forty Corners Street. He will talk to the Public Works Director to get additional information.

Donna Buddenburg, 9170 Lafayette Dr. NW, asked about ways to redirect traffic near Lafayette Dr. and Revere Ave. She suggested that redesigning the traffic pattern might help drivers that are unfamiliar with the intersection navigate it safely. She also asked about the basin in the front of her property. It needs cleaned out multiple times a year. Rohn said he would contact ODOT about getting it fixed. Pizzino told her to stay in contact with Rohn so he can update her about ODOT's response to the request.

Robert Dupree, 9307 Lafayette Dr., said there are four blind hills and intersections in the half-mile stretch near High Mill Ave., Lafayette Dr., and Revere Ave. People do not stop at the stop signs. He added that you must be very cautious in this area to avoid an accident. Mr. Dupree suggested that a "Cross traffic does not stop" sign might help at these troublesome intersections. Vaccaro explained that flashing signs were placed on High Mill Ave. and Revere Ave. a few years ago and ODOT made the Township remove them because they control the intersection. Mr. Dupree asked the Trustees to call the county and they agreed to. He asked how we could get people to observe the posted speed limits in these areas.

Jayne Sterner, 9215 Lafayette Dr., expressed the same concerns as the other residents about the large commercial truck and motorcycle traffic. She suggested that trucks use alternate routes that are not in residential areas. She proposed using State Route 21 to Lake Ave., then to Forty Corners.

Jeremy Burdick, 9259 Lafayette Dr. also spoke about the dangerous intersections and very loud motorcycle traffic on his street.

Chief Brink said that he travels through these intersections daily and understands the resident's concerns. He will write an article for the township newsletter about traffic laws.

Susan Everett, 5000 Suzette Rd. said that her back yard is on Lafayette. She asked why the state did not cut the road elevation lower. They have cut it down twice and it is still not low enough to increase visibility. Her other concern is the posted speed limit and asked if the speed limit can be lowered on Lafayette.

Gonzalez added that there is a long history of trying to resolve roadway and jurisdictional issues between Jackson Township, Stark County, and the State of Ohio. He added that the elected officials share the resident's frustrations with the Ohio Department of Transportation.

Hawke moved and Hardesty seconded a motion to adjourn at 6:05 p.m.
