Whereas, the State of Ohio deemed ground ambulance providers impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic in accordance with the U.S. Treasury's State and Local Fiscal Recovery Final Rule; and,

Whereas, the Ohio General Assembly (134th General Assembly) passed H.B. No. 45 establishing eligibility for Ohio public ambulance transport providers who submitted claims to the Ohio Department of Medicaid during fiscal year 2023 to receive a distribution of funds ("Funding") under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARP") enacted by the federal government; and,

Whereas, the Jackson Township Fire Department operated a public ambulance service during the COVID-19 pandemic and submitted claims to the Ohio Department of Medicaid during fiscal year 2023; and,

Whereas, the Jackson Fire Department received \$5,220.00 of Funding; and,

Whereas, the Funding may be used for premium pay to support the impacts of the essential frontline workers that put themselves at risk to provide care.

Be it resolved that, we hereby acknowledge and affirm that funds (\$5,220.00) received through the H.B. No. 45, via the State of Ohio may be expended only to cover costs consistent with the requirements of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law No. 117-2, and any applicable regulations as set forth in the Ohio Ambulance Transportation Program.

Be it further resolved that, we authorize and approve the expenditure of the funding (\$5,220.34) to eligible departmental staff as determined by the Fire Chief, and to provide workforce relief to those that performed essential work during the COVID-19 pandemic pursuant to the attachment, which is incorporated herein.

Whereas, the Ohio General Assembly (134th General Assembly) passed H.B. No. 169 appropriated a total of \$75 million to provide grants to support communities that have experienced adverse impacts to First Responder personnel during the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor DeWine designated ODPS/OEMA to administer this portion of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. All funding is subject to ARPA guidelines and the final rule for Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds; and

Whereas, the purpose of the First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention and Resiliency ARPA funding is to respond to the negative impacts of the pandemic by addressing the mental wellness needs of Ohio's First Responder Community. The grant also offers assistance in hiring and retention incentives to promote First Responders to remaining in their chosen fields; and,

Whereas, the Jackson Fire Department received \$87,178.46 of Funding; and,

Whereas, the Funding may be used for premium pay to support the impacts of the essential frontline workers that put themselves at risk to provide care.

Be it resolved that, we hereby acknowledge and affirm that funds (\$87,178.46) received through the H.B. No. 169, via the State of Ohio may be expended only to cover costs consistent with the requirements of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law No. 117-2, and any applicable regulations as set forth in the First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention and Resiliency ARPA funding.

John Walsh with GBC Designs, 565 White Pond Drive Akron, Ohio stated they are the engineers and surveyors for the project. The property is kind of a challenge with gas easements. Mr. Walsh explained where the gas easements are on the property. They will leave the southern section R-R and are asking for the northern portion to be rezoned to R-1 for smaller lots. It will blend in very well with the existing neighborhood to the east. Walsh stated they have been in communication with Stark County Engineers about the entrance not being on Strausser due to the traffic.

James Rudo owner of RG3 and VictoryGate Custom Homes. 7656 Lutz Ave. NW, Massillon Ohio. Rudo is the developer and began his career with Fred Tobin prior to going on his own. The property is challenging because of the gas lines. The property is flat and will do well with drainage.

No one came forward in favor for the amendment.
