### SEASONAL SAFETY MESSAGE

### Grilling

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. It can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Learn simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

- Place the grill well away from overhanging branches according to the manufacturer's instructions
- Place the grill a safe distance from lawn games, play areas and foot
- Keep children, pets, and anything that can burn like food wrappers, an oven mitt or towel, at least 3-feet away from open flames and the grill
- Use long-handled grilling tools to give the chef plenty of clearance from heat and flames
  - Have an adult present at all times when a campfire or grill is burning. Keep the fire small and never leave a fire unattended!

### **Pool & Swimming Safety**

Splashing, laughing, having fun, that's what water play is all about! But safety comes first. When kids are in or around water, adults need to stay close and stay focused. Skip the scrolling, save the texts—your full attention is the best way to keep them safe!



### **SUMMER SAFETY TIPS FROM THE JACKSON TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT**

As summer settles in across Jackson Township, our community comes alive with outdoor fun, pool parties, and backyard barbecues. While we're all enjoying the season, your police department wants to share a few important reminders to help keep everyone safe, respectful, and ready for a great summer.

### **Beat the Heat: Stay Cool, Stay Safe**

Ohio's summer heat can be intense, especially during July and August. Here are a few quick tips to keep you and your loved ones safe:

- ✓ Never leave children or pets in a parked car. Even with the windows cracked, temperatures can rise to dangerous levels within minutes.
- ✓ Stay hydrated and wear light-colored, breathable clothing during outdoor activities.
- Check in on elderly neighbors or family members, particularly during heat advisories.
- ✓ If you see someone who appears to be in distress from the heat, call 911 immediately.

### Drive with Care - School's Out

With school out for the summer, children are spending more time outdoors - riding bikes, playing in driveways, and walking to parks.

- Slow down in residential areas and pay close attention at intersections and crosswalks.
- Watch for kids on bikes or scooters, especially in the early evening hours.
- ✓ Be extra careful backing out of driveways—kids can be hard to see.

Our officers will be patrolling neighborhoods with a focus on safe driving. Help us keep our streets safe for all.

### **Fireworks: What You Need to Know**

Under Ohio law, consumer fireworks may now be discharged during specific holidays, including: July 3rd, 4th, and 5th, The weekends immediately before and after July 4th, The first Monday of September and the Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding that day. The hours of use on each of these days are restricted to 4pm to 11pm

Here in Jackson Township, we follow all state guidelines. Please remember:

- Only adults 18 or older may legally discharge fireworks.
- Fireworks must be set off on your own property or with permission from the property owner.
- Be respectful of neighbors, pets, and those sensitive to loud noises—especially veterans and individuals with PTSD.
- Clean up any debris from fireworks after use.

## BEHIND THE SCENES:

### **JACKSON TOWNSHIP POLICE CRASH RECONSTRUCTION TEAM**

When a serious injury or fatal crash occurs in Jackson Township, a specialized team from the Jackson Township Police Department steps in to investigate. Led by Lieutenant Jason Coppock, our Crash Reconstruction Team brings a high level of training, precision, and cutting-edge technology to these complex scenes.

The team is comprised of Detective Steven Hagge and Field Training Officer Anthony Richardson, both of whom have undergone extensive schooling and certification to qualify as crash investigators. Their work plays a critical role in understanding how and why crashes occur, and in some cases, provides crucial evidence for legal proceedings.

One of the primary tools used by the team is Trimble Forensics Capture software. At the scene of a crash, investigators take meticulous GPS measurements of vehicle positions, roadway markings, debris, and other key evidence. These data points are then plotted and overlaid onto satellite imagery, providing an accurate visual representation of the crash site.

This digital reconstruction allows investigators to determine factors like vehicle speed, crash angles, and points of impact—all of which are essential to fully understanding the events that led up to the crash. The precision of the equipment ensures the integrity of the investigation and supports the prosecution of offenders and enhances traffic safety in our community. Although their work may go unseen by most residents, it is vital to keeping our roadways safe and holding drivers accountable when serious accidents occur.

# Summer JJPS Stormwater

Now that summer is officially here, and the kids are out of school, outdoor activities such as swimming, fishing, car washing and lawn care are a part of our everyday activities. All of these activities have one central thing in common: they impact our waterways in Jackson Township.

# **Protect Our Waterways**

In an effort to protect our valuable waterways that become summer recreation sources during the hot weather and the organisms and fish that live in them, the Township would like to provide some tips to residents for controlling water pollution from stormwater discharges:

- Do not dump anything in the storm sewer, such as antifreeze, cleaning supplies, motor oil, paint, etc.
- Do not use excessive amounts of pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers on your lawn.
- If you live adjacent to a waterway, do not mow up to the ditch or stream bank; leave a tall grass buffer to minimize runoff and erosion.
- Install a rain garden to minimize runoff and treat stormwater with attractive native plants.
- Make sure no chlorine is present in pool or spa water before draining the structure. Discharge the water slowly over an open grassy area, not into a stream or storm sewer system.
- Pick up after your pet; pet waste contributes significant amounts of bacteria to our waterways. Dispose of pet waste in the trash.
- Pick up litter to keep our storm sewers and waterways clean.
- Reuse stormwater by collecting it in rain barrels to water plants later.
- Stormwater runoff is most effectively controlled by slowing the water down and allowing it to infiltrate back into the ground slowly. Install pervious pavement, such as paving blocks, grid pavers, pervious concrete or pervious asphalt so water will infiltrate and not immediately run off.
- Take care to absorb spilled fluids from auto maintenance using absorbent towels or kitty litter. Dispose of these items in the trash.
- Wash your car on the lawn or take it to a commercial car wash to minimize pollutant runoff.

# PUBLIC WORKS DEPT.

# Jackson Township Public Works Dept - Highway Division

### **Highway**

This past winter was very hard on the roads within our Township. During the last few months, our Highway staff has reviewed many areas within the township that resulted in heaving due to the heavy frost layer this past year. Many of these problematic areas corrected themselves, but others will need additional attention this spring.

Our staff have already been conducting repairs and full replacement of catch basins and curbing throughout the Township. We have also began working on known drainage issues by examining the current storm systems and planning these repairs.

### **Central Maintenance**

Our Building Maintenance staff has been busy with the many projects and upkeep at all Township facilities. The vehicle maintenance staff continues maintenance on all vehicles under our Fire, Police and Public Works Departments.

### **Parks**

With many projects currently underway in our Parks system, the staff completed the prep work for the North Park Playground by removing all the old wooden pieces that were part of the original installation at the park, as well as the earthwork which will house two of the new pieces. Along with this, the maintenance within North, South and Fisher Park continue. Kirk Schuring Park's proposed fall opening has given our staff the experience to be a part of its creation. Much work is still needed and will take place upon the completion of Phase II this spring.

### **Nash Family Jackson Amphitheater**

It's hard to believe we are starting our 4th year at this venue. The programming in 2025 provides something for all ages. From the Movies in the Park to Outback Ray's Amazing

Animal Shows to both of our free and Summer Concert Series performances, something can be found for all ages at this venue.

# PROJECTS FOR 2025:

### **Central Maintenance**

- The Township's Safety Center A new chiller was installed in late April to replace the original system that was installed.
- Additional projects within Township buildings are being planned and executed.

### **Highway Division**

- Resurfacing: Bid was accepted for \$2.1 Million, which will consist of 18 miles of Township Roads.
- **Curbing Replacement:** Bid was accepted for \$260,000, which will complete roughly 6,900 linear feet of curbing.
- **Restriping of Roadways:** Bids are being prepared at this time.
- Many road drainage projects will be taking place within the Township to address non-functioning or worn out culvert pipes and catch basins. Much of this work will be completed within our repaying program prior to new asphalt being laid.
- Fulton Drive Traffic Light: This light is located at the entrance to Jackson High School, next to the Old School House. The light

- originally went out due to being struck by lightning and resulted in many functions being removed. A new controller box has been purchased and we are awaiting delivery. Installation of the new controller box will take place shortly after it is received.
- Ball field renovations: This project is being placed out to bid with hopes that the remainder of Township owned ball fields will be completed. This is being funded through an Ohio Department of Natural Resource Grant.
- Schuring Park Phase II: With plans to open the park this fall, work is on-going and scheduled to be completed this year. The base asphalt has been laid and both the top coat and striping is scheduled this spring.
- Lighting of the Pickleball Courts: Quotes have been accepted and all products have been ordered. Work has begun and updates will be posted on our website as well.

### **ROAD CLOSURES:**

Fulton Drive, N.W., between Wales Rd (State Route 241) and Cliff Ave., will close to both eastbound and westbound traffic daily commencing:

Monday, June 16, 2025, at 12:00 a.m., through Sunday, June 22, 2025 at 11:00 p.m.

Those seeking to park at Jackson High School may enter through Caritas Circle N.W., or at the high school's entrance adjacent to the old school house, (special access from Fulton Drive and Cliff Ave will be provided).

On Friday, June 20, 2025, the Community Celebration will require the closing of the Township roads to accommodate the 5K run. The road closures could last up to (1) hour.

Mudbrook Street from Wales to Drexel Ave beginning at 8:30 p.m.

### The remainder of the roads listed below will close at 9:00 p.m.

- Courtland Avenue from Mudbrook Avenue to Cheryl Lane Street.
- Chervl Lane Street from Courtland to Cranford Street. 3.
- 4. Courtland Avenue south of Cheryl Lane Street.
- Ruth Lane Avenue south of Cheryl Lane Street.
- Cranford Street from Cheryl Lane Street to Vantage Hill Avenue.
- Vantage Hill Avenue from Cranford Street to Cheryl Lane Street. 7.
- Cheryl Lane Avenue from Vantage Hill Avenue to Arlington Avenue. 8
- Arlington Avenue from Fulton Road to Mubrook Street.
- 10. Greenwich Boulevard from Arlington to Old Bridge Street.
- 11. Old Bridge Street from Greenwich Boulevard to Abbington Street.
- 12. Abbington Street from Old Bridge Street to Arlington Avenue (to Windy Lane Street).
- 13. Windy Lane Street from Arlington Avenue to Windward Trace Circle.
- 14. No access from Cliff Avenue until all runners have passed this point.
- 15. Windward Trace Circle to the 7800 Block, until all runners have entered the park.

### **TEMPORARY PARKING BAN:**

The following streets will need one side of the street marked with no parking signs to facilitate access by emergency response vehicles. This temporary parking ban will need to commence on June 18, 2025 through June 21. 2025:

### RESIDENTIAL NEW CONSTRUCTION AND ADDITIONS TO YOUR PROPERTY

With warmer weather upon us, it's that time of year where residents are starting construction projects on their property. When planning your projects remember to always check with the zoning department as most types of exterior residential construction or alterations and additions, with the exception of home repairs that do not involve structural changes, require a zoning permit. By obtaining a zoning permit, it not only ensures what you want to build is permitted on your property, but also ensures that any proposed structure per a submitted site plan and permit will be in compliance with the zoning regulations. Failure to obtain the proper zoning permit prior to construction may result in penalty fees in addition to the zoning permit fee or having to remove the structure if it is found to be non-compliant with the zoning regulations.

Some of the most common uses that require permits include, but is not limited to, the following:

- Additions to an existing building or structure
- Detached accessory buildings (except those that are 32 sq. ft. or less)
- Temporary carports
- Swimming pools
- Fences
- Hot tub
- Pergola's, arbors, gazebo's
- Temporary storage pods
- · Outdoor wood burning furnaces and fireplaces
- Decks

A permit is not required for a cement, block or brick patios.

Many types of construction requires a building permit in addition to a zoning permit. Township residents should contact the Stark County Building Department at 330-451-1770 for information on building permits.



### **ZONING APPLICATIONS AND PERMITS**

Subdivision of Property Without Plat applications are required per Stark County Regional Planning

Commission for a lot split and also require a signature from the zoning department. Once the application is reviewed and signed off by the zoning department an invoice will be sent for payment. Upon payment the signed document will be emailed to the applicant along with the receipt for payment.

When submitting any application please remember to include your name, address, phone number, and email address on the applicant portion of the application.

For faster processing, electronic application submissions are preferred, but for those without access to a computer may request a paper application to apply for a permit.

Permit payments may be made with a credit card over the phone. Permits that are paid for over the phone or with a mailed check will be emailed to the applicant along with a copy of the receipt once the payment is processed. Payments can also be made in person by check or cash.

# TEMPORARY COMMERCIAL SIGNS FOR BUSINESS USE

Off-premises temporary commercial advertising signs are not permitted to be placed throughout the township and/or within the road right of way. A property owner has the right to remove any signs that are posted on



their property in violation of the zoning resolution. Temporary signs that are located in the road right-of-way and/or in violation of the zoning resolution are subject to removal by the township and disposed of at the townships discretion. Last year over 1,000 illegal temporary signs were removed from road right-of-ways within Jackson Township.

### **RESIDENTIAL GARAGE SALE SIGNS**

A permit is not required for a residential garage sale sign. However, garage sale signs shall not be posted on any utility poles and shall be a minimum of 10 ft. from the edge of pavement, curb or 5 ft. from the road right-of-way. Garage sale signs must be removed upon the conclusion of the sale. Any sign in violation is subject to removal by the township.

### **TRANSIENT VENDORS**

Transient vendors/solicitors are permitted to go door to door upon passing a back ground check and obtaining a permit. Vendors must have a badge and/or carry a copy of the permit with them at all times. Residents are encouraged to contact the police department regarding any vendor/

solicitor who refuses to provide proof of verification of a permit and/or Identification when asked. Residents who do not want vendors/solicitors knocking on their door can obtain a "Do Not Knock" door cling from the township free of charge. Anyone who displays the "Do Not Knock" cling is encouraged to contact the police department if a vendor/solicitor ignores the sign and knocks on the door.

### America 250 is Coming—And Jackson is Getting Ready!



The official celebration of America's 250th anniversary will take place in 2026, but the festivities have already begun! To explore what's happening across Ohio, visit https://america250-ohio.org.

The Jackson Township Historical Society (JTHS) has joined forces with local historical societies, museums, libraries, and

other organizations throughout Stark County to produce a series of short films highlighting the area's rich history.

Currently, JTHS is showcasing a special exhibit titled "Families and Farms" running through July 6. This exhibit offers a unique opportunity to discover the early families who once owned the land where your home now stands. Several past prominent local families are featured in the display.

Starting August 3, our next open house will highlight the history of education in Jackson Township. Before 1930, one-room schoolhouses dotted the township landscape. One of the original schools, Jackson Center School, located next to Jackson High School, now serves as a cherished museum. When the schools were consolidated in 1930, a new central building was established on Mudbrook. Our upcoming exhibit will feature displays on all the local schools, as well as sports, band, and other school activities throughout the years.

As we prepare for the 250th anniversary, we're reflecting on all the reasons Jackson Township residents should be proud. Did you know Jackson was home to the first shopping center in Ohio and the first privately owned fish hatchery in the United States? It was once a vacation destination, a stop on the Ohio & Erie Canal and even had a railroad station. A stagecoach route passed through the township, and at one time, Jackson marked the western boundary of the United States. It was also the site of the world's largest known Paleoindian settlement.

The Jackson Township Historical Society wants to hear from you! Whether you've lived in Jackson your entire life or just recently made it your home. your story matters. As part of the "In Their Words" project for the America 250 celebration, we're collecting personal stories to help capture the spirit and history of our community—straight from the people who know it best.


