Hawke moved and Hardesty seconded a motion whereas, pursuant to Sections 505.87 and 505.871 of the Ohio Revised Code and within the meaning of the Township's Nuisance Legislation, the Board is authorized to determine that a motor vehicle located on private property is a junk motor vehicle within the meaning of Section 505.173 of the Ohio Revised Code and order the property owner to remove any such junk motor vehicle from the property within fourteen (14) days of service of written notice; and if the property owner fails to remove or to cause the removal of the junk motor vehicles from the property within said fourteen days, the Board may proceed to remove the junk motor vehicles from the property and enter the cost of such removal upon the tax duplicate for the property; and,

Whereas, the Zoning Inspector issued a notice to the property owner of record that a silver car (possibly a Dodge/Chrysler make) appears to be inoperable by the condition of the vehicle ("Junk Motor Vehicle") and appears to be three model years or older, apparently inoperable and extensively

damaged, thus constituting “junk motor vehicle” as defined in Section 505.173 of the Ohio Revised Code; and,

Whereas, the Zoning Inspector gave the property owner of record until April 2, 2026, the ability to take corrective action. The property owner of record has failed to take corrective action. A hearing on the matter was set before the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, for May 12, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.

Whereas, Anthony Young and Rachel Young are the owners of the parcel located at 1116 Concord Street NW, Massillon, OH 44646-2208, Parcel No. 1613452, and were sent via USPS regular mail on April 2, 2026, junk motor vehicle violation notice. On April 30, 2026, service of Notice of Hearing was sent via USPS certified mail, return receipt requested. The service of certified mail was perfected on Anthony Young and Rachel Young pursuant to publication as prescribed by 505.871(C)(3).

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, held a hearing on November 13, 2025. Anthony Young did appear or failed to appear for the hearing.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, held a hearing on November 13, 2025. Rachel Young did appear or failed to appear for the hearing.

Be it resolved that the Board hereby determines that the motor vehicles located at 1116 Concord Street NW, Massillon, OH 44646-2208, Parcel No. 1613452, which may be generally described as a silver car (possibly a Dodge/Chrysler make) that appears to be inoperable by the condition of the vehicle (“Junk Motor Vehicle”) are three model years or older, apparently inoperable and extensively damaged, thus constituting “junk motor vehicle” as defined in Section 505.173 of the Ohio Revised Code, and a nuisance within the meaning of the Township’s Nuisance Legislation.

Be it further resolved that the Board hereby determines that it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents that the Board proceed under Sections 505.87 and 505.871 of the Ohio Revised Code, and within the meaning of the Township’s Nuisance Legislation, to order and the Board hereby orders that the record owner of the Property (“Record Owner”), or the Executor for the estate of the Record Owner or other lawful representative for the Record Owner remove or provide for the removal of the Junk Motor Vehicles from the Property within fourteen (14) days of the date of receipt of written notice of passage of this Resolution.

Be it further resolved that the Board authorizes the Township Zoning Inspector to provide written notice to the Record Owner, his representative(s) or the Executor of the estate of the Record Owner, and to the holders of liens of record on the Property, of the Board’s intention to remove or cause the removal of the Junk Motor Vehicles from the Property as provided in Section 505.871(C) of the Ohio Revised Code.

Be it further resolved that if the Record Owner, his representative(s) or the Executor of the estate of the Record Owner does not remove or cause the removal of the Junk Motor Vehicles from the Property within fourteen (14) days of receipt of written notice of the passage of this Resolution evidencing the Board’s intention to remove or cause the removal of the Junk Motor Vehicles from the Property, then the Township Administrator is authorized to order Township employees, materials and equipment to be used to remove the Junk Motor Vehicles from the Property or to enter into a contract with a motor vehicle salvage dealer or scrap metal processing facility, as defined in Sections

4738.01 and 4737.05 of the Ohio Revised Code, for removal of the Junk Motor Vehicles, and all costs and expenses incurred in connection therewith, in an amount not to exceed \$500.00, shall be paid from the Township's general fund, which funds are hereby appropriated for the purpose.

Be it further resolved that the Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in formal actions were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including but not limited to, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, except as otherwise permitted thereby.

Whereas, 1116 Concord Street NW, Massillon, OH 44646-2208, (Parcel No. 1613452) a single-family residence is occupied; and,

Whereas, Anthony Young and Rachel Young were sent via certified mailing on April 28, 2026, notice of the May 12, 2026, hearing to include a copy of the April 2, 2026, Final Notice of Nuisance Violation. Delivery via U.S. Mail Certified Green Card Return Receipt was perfected on April 30, 2026, at 1116 Concord Street NW, Massillon, OH 44646-2208. The green card receipt indicating it was signed for by "Tony Young"; and,

Whereas, the following lien holders of record were served with notice of the hearing:

1. State of Ohio: Ohio Department of Taxation

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, held a hearing on May 12, 2026. Anthony Young did appear or failed to appear for the hearing; and,

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio, held a hearing on May 12, 2026. Carol Young did appear or failed to appear for the hearing; and,

Whereas, the attached November 15, 1989 (amended April 25, 2011) Nuisance Legislation is incorporated herein.

Be it resolved that we hereby find that you have garbage, trash, rubbish, and other debris existing on your property relating to the enclosed legislation, including but not limited to various items on the front porch of the home and behind and around the perimeter of a detached garage. You are using a

travel trailer (camper) as a storage apparatus as noted on the exterior of the trailer in violation of the Jackson Township Zoning Resolution, and other miscellaneous steel/metal objects in the driveway which presents a safety hazard and violates the community standard for a single family residential within the meaning of the Refuse/Debris List contained in the attached November 15, 1989 Nuisance Legislation (amended April 25, 2011).

Be it further resolved that the piling of the material as described in the preceding paragraphs obstructs the reasonable and comfortable use of surrounding properties in that:

1. The Jackson Board of Trustees, having taken into account all the facts presented and the surrounding circumstances, marks the photographs and Final Notice of Nuisance Violation of the Zoning Inspector as Exhibits.
2. Taking into account the property owner's interest in the free use of his land, the refuse, garbage and debris found on the property violates the average property owner's sensitivities of the community standard for the area.
3. The Jackson Township Board of Trustees declare and find a Nuisance exists within the meaning of the attached November 15, 1989, Nuisance Legislation (amended April 25, 2011) and Ohio Revised Code 505.87, at 1116 Concord Street NW, Massillon, OH 44646-2208, Parcel No. 1613452, which is owned by Anthony Young and Rachel Young.
4. The Jackson Board of Trustees declares and finds service was perfected upon all interested parties.

Be it further resolved that the Law Director has obtained a report of the owners of record or holders of legal or equitable liens of record upon the real estate.

Be it further resolved that the Law Director shall issue a Notice to Abate Nuisance consistent with this resolution and the attached November 15, 1989, Nuisance Legislation (amended April 25, 2011), and Ohio Revised Code Section 505.87(B) and (E).
