CHAPTER 1: SCOPE AND ADMINISTRATION

SECTION 101 – GENERAL

101.1 Title.

These regulations shall be known as the Jackson Township Parking Regulations of Vehicles and Items Placement of Items on Roadways, hereinafter referred to as the “Jackson Township Parking Resolution”.

101.2 Scope.

The provisions of these regulations shall apply to all vehicles, including commercial trucks, all moving vans, commercial and private trailers, semi-trailers, portable storage units (PODS) or dumpsters parking in Jackson Township, including, but not limited to, parking on any Township street, or highway, including public way and right of way, parking on established roadways proximate to buildings, and parking on private property as necessary to provide access to the property by public safety vehicles and equipment.

101.3 Intent.

These regulations shall be construed to secure its expressed intent, which is to ensure public health, safety, and welfare insofar as they are affected by parked vehicles impeding travel.

101.4 Severability.

If a section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of these regulations is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of these regulations.

SECTION 102 – APPLICABILITY

102.1 General.

The provisions of these regulations shall apply to all matters affecting or relating to parking in Jackson Township.

102.2 Existing Remedies.

The provisions of these regulations shall not be construed to abolish or impair existing remedies of the Township or its officers or agencies relating to the citation or removal of illegally or dangerously parked vehicles.

102.3 Conflict of Laws. The provisions of these regulations shall apply to all matters affecting or relating to parking on any Township street, or highway, including public way and right of way, and parking on established roadways within the unincorporated area of the Township, as set forth herein. In any case where a provision of these regulations is found to be in conflict with a provision of any applicable zoning, building, fire, safety, health regulation, other regulations, statutes or resolutions, the provision which establishes the higher standard for the promotion and protection of the safety and health of the people shall govern, unless otherwise provided by law. Where, in a specific case, different sections of these regulations specify different requirements, the same standard shall apply.

102.4 Registered Owner Prima-Facie Liable for Unlawful Acts.

In any hearing on a charge of illegally parking a motor vehicle, testimony that a vehicle bearing a certain license plate was found unlawfully parked as prohibited by the provisions of this Traffic Code, and further testimony that the record of the Ohio Registrar of Motor Vehicles shows that the license plate was issued to the defendant, shall be prima-facie evidence that the vehicle which was unlawfully parked, was so parked by the defendant. A certified registration copy, showing such fact, from the Registrar shall be proof of such ownership.

CHAPTER 2: DEFINITIONS

SECTION 201 – GENERAL

201.1 Scope.

Unless otherwise expressly stated, the following terms shall, for the purposes of these regulations, have the meanings shown in this chapter.

201.2 Interchangeability.

Words stated in the present tense include the future; words stated in the masculine gender include the feminine and neuter; the single number includes the plural and the plural, the singular.

201.3 Terms Not Defined.

Where terms are not defined in these regulations, the usual customary definition shall apply.

201.4 Capitalization.

Defined words may begin with an uppercase or lower case letter, interchangeably and without significance as to their meaning.

SECTION 202 – GENERAL DEFINITIONS defined in section ORC 4511.01, other ORC Section as marked, or as addressed in Section 201.3

CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT. Such would fall within the definition of a Vehicle and would encompass construction equipment and the attachments, special service tools, or repair parts for such equipment together with mobile, motorized utility maintenance equipment used in construction or road maintenance. (ORC Section 1353.01 (J)).

DRIVER OR OPERATOR. A driver or operator is means every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle, trackless trolley, or streetcar. (Y)

DUMPSTER. Any container designed or used for the collection and hauling of waste or debris, including but not limited to roll-off containers or boxes and bin containers.

GROSS WEIGHT. The weight of a vehicle plus the weight of any load thereon. (V)

MOVING VAN. A truck with an enclosed cargo space generally used for the moving of residential or commercial property from one location to another.

OWNER. Any person having a legal or equitable interest in property or otherwise having control of the property.

PERSON. Means every natural person, firm, co-partnership, association, or corporation. (W).

PORTABLE STORAGE UNIT (POD). Any container transported to a designated location for storage or moving purposes (typically known as PODS, MODS, etc.).

PREMISES. A lot, plot or parcel of land, easement or public way, including any structures thereon.

PROPERTY. Property has the same meaning as “premises” as that term is defined herein.

PUBLIC WAY. Is the surface of, and the space within, through, on, across, above, or below, any public street, public road, public highway, public freeway, public lane, public path, public alley, public court, public sidewalk, public boulevard, public parkway, public drive, public easement, and any other land dedicated or otherwise designated for a compatible public use, which, on or after July 2, 2002, is owned or controlled by a municipal corporation. "Public way" excludes a private easement. ORC 4939.01(N)

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES. Anything that is used for camping which includes large Class A, Class B, Class C, fifth-wheel trailers, popup campers, truck campers, travel trailers, skoolies and watercraft trailer.

RIGHT OF WAY. A general term denoting land, property, or the interest therein, usually in the configuration of a strip, acquired for or devoted to transportation purposes. When used in this context, right-of-way includes the roadway, shoulders or berm, ditch, and slopes extending to the right-of-way limits under the control of the state or local authority. (UU)(2)

ROADWAY. Portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel and parking lanes, not including the berm, sidewalk, or shoulder, even if the berm, sidewalk, or shoulder is used by a person operating a bicycle or other human powered vehicle. If a highway includes two or more separate roadways the term “roadway” means any such roadway separately but not all such roadways collectively. (EE)

SEMI-TRAILER. Semi-trailer means every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property with another and separate motor vehicle so that in operation a part of its own weight or that of its load, or both, rests upon and is carried by another vehicle. (N)

STREET OR HIGHWAY. A general term for denoting a public way for purposes of travel by vehicles, streetcars, trackless trolleys, and vulnerable road users, including the entire area within the right-of-way. (BB)

TOWNSHIP. Township refers to the unincorporated area of Jackson Township, Stark County, Ohio.

TRAILER. A trailer means every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property wholly on its own structure and for being drawn by a motor vehicle, including any such

vehicle when formed by or operated as a combination of a “semi-trailer,” and a vehicle of the dolly type, such as that commonly known as a “trailer dolly,” a vehicle used to transport agricultural produce or agricultural production materials between a local place of storage or supply and the farm when drawn or towed on a street highway at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour, and a vehicle designed and used exclusively to transport a boat between a place of storage and a marina, or in and around a marina, when drawn or towed on a street or highway for a distance of more than ten miles or at a speed of more than twenty-five miles per hour. (M)

TRUCK. A truck is every motor vehicle, except trailers and semi-trailers, designed and used to carry property. (K). A commercial truck is a motor vehicle and shall not exceed 9,000 lbs. GVW (gross vehicle weight) and the maximum height of the vehicle body does not exceed seven (7) feet in height.

VEHICLE. Means every device, including a bicycle, motorized bicycle, and an electric bicycle, in, upon, or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn upon a highway. "Vehicle" does not include any motorized wheelchair, any electric personal assistive mobility device, any low-speed micro mobility device, any personal delivery device as defined in section 4511.513 of the Revised Code, any device that is moved by power collected from overhead electric trolley wires or that is used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks, or any device that is moved by human power. (A)

CHAPTER 3: STREET PARKING AND RIGHT OF WAY RESTRICTIONS

SECTION 301 – GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

301.1 On Street Parking.

No person shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, at any time, on the attached (Exhibit A) described roadways within the unincorporated area of the Township.

301.2 Fire Lanes.

No person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, at any time, in any fire lane designated by traffic control devices properly erected and/or posted at the location of the designated lane.

301.3 Parking in Handicapped Spaces.

- (a) No person shall stop, stand, or park any motor vehicle at accessible parking locations provided under division (E) of this section or at accessible clearly marked parking locations provided in or on privately owned parking lots, parking garages, or other parking areas and designated in accordance with that division, unless one of the following applies:
- (i) The motor vehicle is being operated by or for the transport of a person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk and is displaying a valid removable windshield placard or accessible license plates;
 - (ii) The motor vehicle is being operated by or for the transport of a person with a disability and is displaying a parking card or accessible license plates.

(b) Any motor vehicle that is parked in an accessible marked parking location in violation of division (F)(1)(a)(i) or (ii) of this section may be towed or otherwise removed from the parking location by the law enforcement agency of the political subdivision in which the parking location is located. A motor vehicle that is so towed or removed shall not be released to its owner until the owner presents proof of ownership of the motor vehicle and pays all towing and storage fees normally imposed by that political subdivision for towing and storing motor vehicles. If the motor vehicle is a leased vehicle, it shall not be released to the lessee until the lessee presents proof that that person is the lessee of the motor vehicle and pays all towing and storage fees normally imposed by that political subdivision for towing and storing motor vehicles.

(c) If a person is charged with a violation of division (F)(1)(a)(i) or (ii) of this section, it is an affirmative defense to the charge that the person suffered an injury not more than seventy-two hours prior to the time the person was issued the ticket or citation and that, because of the injury, the person meets at least one of the criteria contained in division (A)(1) of section 4503.44 of the Revised Code.

(2) No person shall stop, stand, or park any motor vehicle in an area that is commonly known as an access aisle, which area is marked by diagonal stripes and is located immediately adjacent to an accessible parking location provided under division (E) of this section or at an accessible clearly marked parking location provided in or on a privately owned parking lot, parking garage, or other parking area and designated in accordance with that division.

301.4 Jackson Township Parks.

No person shall violate attached Section 101.10(E) of the regulations applicable to all designated Jackson Township Parks.

301.5 Stark County Library District Property.

No person shall park any vehicle on the attached (Exhibit B) described property which is leased by the Board of Trustees of the Stark County District Library from the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township except by patrons of or persons going into the library building for business or other use.

301.6 Parking of Recreational Vehicles.

No person shall park a recreational vehicle, bus or watercraft on any street, public way or right of way, in any residential district, other than to load or unload for no longer than twelve (12) hours. For the purposes of this section, the term "recreational vehicle" means any vehicle, whether motorized or not, that meets one of the following: designed for the sole purpose of recreational travel, is not used for the purpose of engaging in business for profit or intrastate commerce, is not regulated by the Public Utilities Commission pursuant to Chapter 4905, 4921, or 4923 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC), is classed as a bus travel trailer, motor home, truck camper, fifth wheel camper, camper trailer or park trailer; or has been converted from its original design purpose for use as one of the above.

301.7 Truck/Trailer/Semi-trailer Parking Prohibitions.

Except as authorized by permit in Section 303 of these regulations, and with the exception of vehicles which have been registered and licensed as a passenger vehicle or a non-commercial truck and/or unless otherwise posted, no moving van, truck, trailer, or semi-trailer shall be permitted to park or stored along any Township street, residential district, or within the public way or right of way, other than to load or unload for no longer than six hours (6) hours. Moving vans, non and commercial trailers and/or semi-trailers so parked for loading or unloading must be connected to a towing vehicle at all times. Commercial

Vehicles and/or Trailers are prohibited at all times, with the exception of loading, unloading and performing job related duties no longer than twelve (12) hours.

301.8 Construction Equipment.

Equipment such as excavators, bulldozers, loaders, skid steers, and dump trucks which may be used to perform various tasks in building, construction and/or infrastructure projects, may be parked within road, public way or right of way, as long as it does not interfere with traveling public or sight clearance, and a project of reasonable duration is in progress. The parking and storing of excavators, bulldozers, loaders, skid steers, dump trucks and other similar construction equipment is prohibited from being parked or stored along any Township street, residential district, or within the public way or right of way.

301.9 Portable Storage Unit (POD) and Dumpster Parking Prohibitions.

Except as authorized by permit in Section 303 of these regulations, no portable storage unit (POD) or dumpster shall be permitted to park along any Township street other than to load or unload. Portable storage units (PODS) and dumpsters so parked for loading or unloading must be connected to a towing vehicle at all times.

301.10 Twelve (12) Hour Parking Limitation for Loading and Unloading.

Parking is prohibited for longer than twelve (12) hours on any street, public way or other property open to the public for purposes of vehicular travel, or upon or within the right-of-way of any street unless the owner of the vehicle, moving van, trailer, or semi-trailer notifies the Jackson Township Public Works Department for permission.

301.11 Parking -Prohibited Acts.

No person shall stand or park a trackless trolley or vehicle in violation of Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.68 to include on a sidewalk.

SECTION 302 – LANDSCAPING / BUILDING MATERIALS WITHIN ROADWAY AND RIGHT OF WAY

302.1 General Statement.

The placement of landscaping and/or building materials shall not be permitted within the Township's roads at any time. This includes such items as mulch, rocks or gravel, cement blocks, or any similar item that would be used for the purpose of landscaping or construction. Per ORC Section 5571.14, these objects may be declared a public nuisance if determined they obstruct or endanger the public travel of the road.

302.2 Road Right of Way.

Landscaping and/or Building materials placed within the public road right of way shall be clearly identified with the use of such items as barricades or traffic cones and must not interfere with the traveling public or sight clearance. ORC Sections 505.17 and 4521.02.

SECTION 303 – EXCEPTION TO PARKING PROHIBITION

303.1 General Statement.

The parking prohibitions/permitting structure set forth in this section have been established due to specific traffic hazards and safety concerns which occur when large vehicles are parked on Township streets or items are placed in township roadways, especially for extended periods of time.

303.2 General Prohibition.

As is established in Section 301 of this Resolution, the parking of moving vans, trailers, semi-trailers, dumpsters, and portable storage units (PODS) is generally prohibited on any Township street except to load or unload. In addition, such vehicles and containers so parked for loading or unloading must be connected to a towing vehicle at all times.

303.3 Temporary Parking Exception Subject to Snow Emergencies.

Temporary Parking exception issued pursuant to this Section are subject to interruption due to a declaration of a Snow Emergency declared pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 505.17 and 4521.02. All vehicles shall comply with a declaration of a Snow Emergency declared pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 505.17 and 4521.02.

303.4 Criteria for Granting a Temporary Parking.

Exceptions to allow temporary parking for commercial trucks, moving vans, trailers, semi-trailers, dumpsters, and portable storage units (PODS) will be issued to persons in the sole discretion of the Public Works Director, or its designee:

- a) Who cannot reasonably locate the commercial trucks, moving van, trailer, semi-trailer, portable storage unit (POD), or dumpster on an impervious surface other than on the Township street or in the Township right-of-way; and,
- b) Who are utilizing the commercial trucks, moving van, trailer, semi-trailer, dumpster, or portable storage unit (POD) for bona fide moving, rehabilitation and/or construction purposes within a defined period of time, as contemplated in these rules and regulations.
- c) Denial of temporary parking exception is not appealable.

CHAPTER 4: SPECIAL EVENT/TEMPORARY PARKING PROHIBITIONS

SECTION 401 – GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

401.1 General Statement.

The parking prohibitions set forth in this section have been established due to specific traffic hazards and safety concerns associated with temporary events and conditions. The Township shall post temporary “No Parking” signs in the affected areas at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of such temporary events unless such notice is not possible or practical given the nature or timing of the event.

401.2 Miscellaneous Temporary Parking Prohibitions.

Parking is prohibited at any location and for any duration deemed necessary by the Township as a result of conditions, events, or activities which render parking hazardous or contrary to the public safety and welfare.

CHAPTER 5: ENFORCEMENT

SECTION 501 – UNLAWFUL ACTS

501.1 Unlawful Acts.

It shall be unlawful for a person to be in conflict with or in violation of any of the provisions of these regulations.

SECTION 502 – PENALTIES AND FINES

502.1 Parking Infractions.

Parking infractions in these regulations that occur within the jurisdiction of the Jackson Township Parking Violations Bureau shall be handled pursuant to and be governed by the provisions of this ORC Chapter 4521.

502.2 Parking Ticket.

The attached parking ticket shall be used as the parking ticket issued under this Resolution. The procedure for issuing parking tickets shall be governed by attached ORC Section 4521.03 or other applicable Sections in ORC Chapter 4521 all of which are incorporated (Exhibit C) herein.

502.3 Violation Penalties.

(A) No persons violating any regulation or order adopted pursuant to this Resolution shall be charged with a criminal offense and no person shall be arrested as a result of the commission of such violation.

(B) Whoever violates any of these regulations or any regulation herein shall be issued a parking ticket a law enforcement officer. The answer to the ticket or failure to answer shall be referred to the Jackson Township Parking Violations Bureau created pursuant to Journal Entry 145, filed June 28, 1991.

(B) Whoever violates any regulation or order adopted pursuant to these regulations shall be fined Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). Failure to pay said fine within 7 days of its issuance will result in an additional fine of Twenty Five Dollars (for a total fine of \$75.00). Failure to pay said fine within fourteen days of its issuance will result in an additional fine of Twenty-Four Dollars (for a total fine of \$99.00).

502.4 Answering Parking Ticket.

A person who is issued a parking ticket under these regulations shall answer the parking ticket within the time frame endorsed on the ticket. Failure to answer shall be considered an admission that the person committed the parking infraction, and a default civil judgment, in the amount of the fine, penalties, and costs due may be entered against the person. Failure to timely answer the parking infraction identified in the notification of infraction may result in the imposition of the additional penalties prescribed by ordinance, resolution, or regulation of the local authority enacted pursuant to ORC section 4521.02 of the Revised Code or by the court.

SECTION 503 – TOWING AND IMPOUNDMENT

503.1 Right to Tow/Impound Vehicles.

The Township Chief of Police, or any Township police officer may, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code section 4513.61(A)(2), order into storage and tow, or have towed, any vehicle parked in violation of these regulations or for unpaid parking fines. The owner or any lien holder of a vehicle ordered into storage may claim the vehicle upon presentation of proof of ownership, which may be shown by a certificate of title to the vehicle, and payment of all expenses, charges, and fines incurred as a result of the current and past parking violations and removal and storage of the vehicle.

SECTION 504 – ABATEMENT AND OTHER LAWFUL REMEDIES

504.1 Abatement of violation.

The imposition of the fines and penalties herein prescribed shall not preclude Jackson Township from instituting, by and through its Law Director, appropriate action to enjoin, restrain, correct or abate a violation, or to stop an illegal act.

504.2 Emergency Measures.

Nothing in the provisions of these regulations shall prohibit the Law Director, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Public Works Director, or Zoning Inspector from taking any action authorized by law, without regard to the provisions of these regulations and regardless of whether the legal procedures herein described have been instituted, when, in his or her opinion, or in the opinion of any other pertinent code official, there is imminent danger to the public, which endangers life, or those in the proximity of any parked vehicles prohibited herein, because of explosives, explosive fumes, or vapors or the presence of toxic fumes, gases, or materials, or operation of defective or dangerous equipment.
